1.0 INTRODUCTION

This report covers the activities of the Asofan District for the period 1st January to 31st December, 2025. The report focuses largely on the Strategic Goals, Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and touches and some notable events during the period under review.

2.0 ORGANIZATION AND STAFFING

There were fourteen (14) Agents of the District in the year under review. Six (6) Reverend Ministers, Six (6) Catechists and two (2) Retired Ministers

The District remained timely in all statutory remittances to upper court in the year under review.

a) Meeting Reporting Deadlines

■ OG-02 – Meeting reporting deadlines has been challenging, however the District did her best to meet some reporting deadlines.

4.0 DEPARTMENTAL GOALS

4.1 MISSION & EVANGELISM

a) Key Performance Indicators

■ ME-01: The membership of the District grew from **3,932** to **4,642** in the year under review

■ ME-01B: Discipleship classes is organised at some congregations.

- ME-2: The District was able to organised four (4) mission activities at Amuman. Forty two (42) souls have been won so far.
- ME-02B: Ministry to the mile 7 police cell visit was organised by the ESR Committee.

b) *Strategies*

- The M&E Committee donated two (2) sets of jerseys and two (2) footballs to the town folks and the community school.

4.2 ADMINISTRATION AND HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- AHRM-01: The District organized one training programme for Agents.
- AHRM-02: The District organised one training programme for staff of the District
- AHRM-03: This District could not the form C on the ERP

4.3 PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT, BUILDING AND PROPERTY

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- AHRM-5: The KPI not achieved. Only Peace Congregation has a Land Title Certificate.
- AHRM-6: The District is in the process of insuring all landed properties.

b) *Strategies*

- The District has constantly reminded and encouraged the Congregations to contact Trinity Insurance Brokers (TIB) and negotiate for their landed properties to be insured.

4.4 ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- ESR-01 – The District organised two (2) public interest programmes with one hundred and ninety five (195) members participating
 - ESR-03: Participating in local council of churches programme achieved
 - ESR-04: Healthy relationship with other faith is promoted. Some Congregations organised joint programmes with people of other faith.
 - ESR-04: Healthy relationships and Ministry to the palace is promoted with some Chief’s attending the District’s programmes.
- b) *Way forward*
 - The District is putting measures in place to achieve at least two of these targeted goals in the coming year

4.5 DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES

- a) *Key Performance Indicators*
 - DSS-01: An activity on healthy living, sanitation and care for environment was successfully organized with 225 members participating.
 - DSS-02 – Livelihood and person’s with disability achieved with 5 people supported.
 - DSS-03: These KPIs were achieved with 157 members participating.
 - DSS-03B: Christmas street party organized and 215 people were fed.
- b) *Strategies*
 - Clean up exercise, entrepreneurial skills and health screening were organized for members, whilst some members also hit the streets to feed the beggars.
- c) *Way forward*
 - *To extend the charismas street party beyond the District and organize more entrepreneurial skills for the youth.*
 - The District plans on organizing clean-up exercise which we will involve Asofan market and some of the community members. To also encourage the Congregations to increase the numbers of street beggar’s to be feed next year.

4.6 WELFARE

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- DSS-04: The target KPI of attending to the general welfare needs was achieved. One hundred and sixty eight (168) members supported.
- DSS-05: Extremely distressed members were supported. Thirty (30) members supported so far.
- DSS-06: The support for the livelihood development of needy members was achieved. Thirty eight(38) members supported,

b) *Strategies*

- Donations and special funds raising was organised to supported members who were bereaved and sick.

c) *Way Forward*

- To entreat the congregations to raise enough funds through fund-raising and also institute weekly contributions to meet the increasing demands of the welfare needs of members.

4.7 FINANCE

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- FIN-01: Annual audited financial report is in the process of signing.
- FIN-02: Expenditure on missions & evangelism, Welfare, Education and Scholarship was achieved
- FIN-03: The District was able to transfer all its 52/48 contributions weekly as at the time of reporting.
- FIN-03B: Kuntuse project contribution achieved. Funds transferred amounted to GHC 5,941.50.

b) *Strategies*

- 52/48 contribution's documentations were mostly prepared after Sunday services and submitted to the district latest by Tuesday which aide us to achieve this target.

4.8 EDUCATION

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- EDU-01 - EDU-04: Targets for these KPIs were achieved.
- EDU-02: School worship in basic school. Fifty Eight (58) worship services held.
- EDU-03: Reading and speaking of Ghanaian language is on-going.

b) *Way forward*

- To organise WASSCE clinic for members at the congregational level.

4.9 SCHOLARSHIPS

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- EDU-05 – Visitation to the SHS achieved. Twenty six students (26) visited.
- EDU-6: Mentorship programme was organised for the youth. Twelve (12) members were mentored
- EDU-07: KPIs achieved. Some Congregations continue to offer financial support to the poor and the needy.

b) *Way forward*

- To encourage the Congregation to identify the poor and needy in the church and support them financially.

4.10 CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- CLN-01: The target for increased attendance to church was achieved. 2,304 members attend church averagely.
- CLN-02: Attendance to generational groups meeting declined. 781 members attends meetings averagely
- CLN-03: Participation in soul winning achieved. Forty five (45) members attending
- CLN-04: Some Presbyters and committee members received regular training.

b) *Strategies*

- The Sessions and the generational group executives were tasked to visit the groups during their meetings.

c) *Way Forward*

- *The Chairperson of CLAN will schedule series of meetings with the executives of the various groups to build on the gains made so far, and also facilitate the training of Presbyters and Committee members.*

4.11 COUNSELING AND FAMILY LIFE

a) *Key Performance Indicators*

- CLN-05: The KPI achieved. One hundred and ninety six (16) members participated
- CLN-06: The KPI achieved with Sixty one (61) people counselled so far.

b) *Strategies*

- Agents of some Congregations met with some couples whilst other counselling were organized for members at their group meetings, and also through speaking.

c) *Way forward*

- The District has entreated the congregations to consider forming counselling committee which would include, the Rtd. Agent(s) some past and current presbyters who would be trained to help the Agent(s) in providing counselling services.

5.0 MAJOR CHALLENGES

- The District continue to face infrastructure deficit in the area of permanent church building and Manse for Agent(s)
- Attendance to church services and group meetings at the various stations has declined although we continue to encourage the various sessions' to follow up on members regularly and checked up on them.

NOTABLE EVENTS:

Below is the tabulation of some of notable events in the year under review;

- The District Men's fellowship has adopted Bethel Preaching point Children service and supported their activities
- 37 Junior Youth members participated in the Presbytery Ghanaian Language Exams
- The District took delivery of another Royal (150cc) Motorbike through the initiative of Rev. Daniel Opong-Wereko, Minister-in-Charge of Peace Congregation to be used for Administrative and Mission work.
- Praise Preaching Point was elevated to full fledge congregational status on 16th November, 2025.
- Bro. Clinton Owusu Afriyie elected as the YPG Superintendent of the Ga West Presbytery. His induction was held on 21st December, 2026 at Love Congregation
- Bro. Eric Tawiah elected as the National JY President, his induction was held on 21st September, 2025 at Love Congregation
- The District hosted the commissioning of twenty three (23) ministerial probationers on 1st June, 2025 at Love Congregation-Asofan.
- The M&E Team donated two set of jerseys and two footballs to the Amuman community school and the town folks.
- The District YPG placed 1st position in the Inter District Zonal Quiz and the Presbytery Quiz finals respectively.

- A foundation Stone-Laying ceremony was held at Peace Congregation church Auditorium on the 11th of May, 2025 by the Chairperson Rev. Enoch Adjei Pobee.
- The Chairperson Rev. Enoch Adjei Dedicated a mechanized borehole, donated by Rev. Daniel Opong-Wereko and family with support from Dr. Jim. Levernier by Pobee
- The District Young People Guild (YPG) donated an industrial sewing machine to a member who is into sewing.
- The District YPG represented the Ga West Presbytery to win the Grand finale of the 2025 national quiz competition
- The District JY came third (3rd) at the Presbytery quiz
- The District children service came third (3rd) at the Presbytery quiz
- The District hosted the Induction of the National Junior Youth leaders Fellowship at the head station
- Love Congregation Dedicated a two storey building Manse at New Asofan. The dedication was officiated by the Chairperson, Rev. Enoch Adjei Pobee.
