- **INTRODUCTION**

This is a comprehensive report presented by the District Clerk from 1st January, 2025, to 31st December, 2025, and it covers organisation and staffing, goals, statistical data, notable events and activities, as well as major challenges. Pursuant to Article 22(13) a of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana Constitution, I hereby present this report to the Presbytery Session.

- **ADMINISTRATION AND HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT**

Standing Committee

There are six members on the standing committee led by Rev. Daniel Opong-wereko who took over the reigns of the district after end in service of Rev. G.N Odonkor and also has new appointments in the positions of the ministers and Presbyters Representative. As the one-year tenure of Abraham Nii Adu Okine (Ministers Rep) and Mad. Lydia Siaw Lartey (Presbyters rep) ended this year, new appointments were made to the district standing committee as follows: Rev. Christian Odei-Akyea (Ministers’ Rep) and Elder Ofosu-Hene Amoah (Presbyters’ Rep) respectively.

Administration

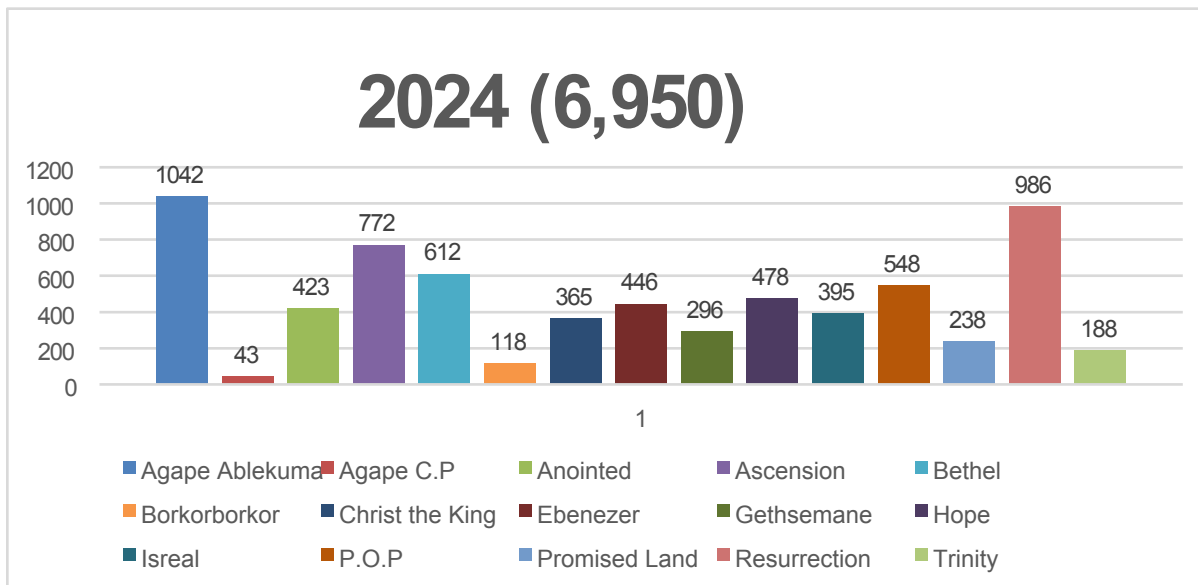

Retirements

This year, four of our agents are due retirement. They are, the Rev. Ebenezer Kwafu Ansa, Catechists' Elijah Adom Mpere, Samuel Agyekum Mensah and Christiana Asare Yeboah with the trio of catechists going on voluntary retirement. We wish them all the best ahead of their end of service.

- **CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE**

The year under review marks exactly seven years since the inception of the Ablekuma District, evidenced by notable highs and lows but the sum of it is that, God has proven faithful. The year under review has seen much greater commitment to the districts activities. The districts upturn in fortunes is visible through many

metrics notable of which are positive attendance to district council meetings, revivals among others. We are profoundly grateful to all sessions and CLAN affiliates in the hope that more can be achieved. This surge presents an opportunity for growth waiting to be seized. In a bid to improve submission of reports and remittances, plaques were presented as awards to congregations who stood out in the submissions. Notably, Resurrection, Ebenezer, Christ the King Congregation placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively.

This year, there has been changes in the sessions of some stations and also notable changes at group levels. It is our wish that going forwards the district will be involved during the poll processes leading to the election of presbyters and executives to aid administrative work and the constitution of council and session.

- **DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

Natural Disasters

Two of our stations notably the Israel and Anointed Congregations faced damages to their church. With the former, their children and JY block suffered damages during thunderstorms that has rendered the block unusable and with the latter a severe fire outbreak to the main church building has made church life unbearable and a great weight of renovation to be done. Upon visitation by the district minister and some standing committee members, a cash donation of 10,000 GHC was made with 8,000 GHC given to the Anointed Congregation and 2,000 GHC issued to Israel Congregation. Similar donations was made by the district YAF while other stations have pledged their support over time. We wish that the needed support and show of solidarity will be given to these affected stations by the presbytery. Upon evaluation of the Anointed chapel by an architect, fears of severe damage to the building was allayed with recommendations made on renovating the entire roofing and wiring works. Currently, service is still ongoing and works underway in the same premise.

Income Generating Projects

The borehole project, which for now is the only money generating asset of the district has not to lived up to its purpose, however, extra feasibility studies on its sustenance has been made and with the expertise of our district minister on the said project, expansion works are due to be carried out.

We are not where we have to be but also more importantly, we are not where we used to be. There has been improvement and there will be improvement if only we show much added passion and infectious commitment toward the mandate of Christ and his church.

- **MISSION AND EVANGELISM**

Asempatre and Revivals

This year the district M&E responded positively to the decision of council to establish a church at Agbozome. The church commenced on the 7th December 2025, prior to which was evangelistic activities. A temporal place of worship has been secured at the residence of a Presbyterian member. The committee also helped steer the organization of three revivals in the district which were well attended. This is worth commending.

- **EDUCATION**

The annual pen's down praise event for BECE leavers was held and well patronized by the few that attended. Awards was presented to best three students who stood out in the BECE at the district session. Prior to this, the annual seminar for candidates was held while some candidates sat for the presbytery preparatory exam.

- **PROPERTY AND DEVELOPMENT**

Manse and Office Renovations

Work at the Manse and the district offices has been done with massive upgrade and huge cost implications after years of lack of adequate and appropriate renovations. The facilities are now in good condition and we hope to have much consistent renovations instead of delayed ones which only makes work more enormous. Special mention to Cat. E.A Dankyi, our Lay rep who led the standing committee in oversight duties.

- **NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS & EVENTS**

Valedictory service

A befitting valedictory service was held at the Agape Congregation in honour of the astute work of Rev. G.N Odonkor, a ceremony which drew applause from the Ga West Presbytery Clerk, Rev. K. K. Sarpong. Prior to this event, a praise and worship event was organized in honor of Papa which drew an audience of over 150 people at the Resurrection Congregation.

Ministerial Trainings

Mr. Isaac Bosompem Gyekye, now Rev. Isaac Bosompem Gyekye, once the caretaker of the Trinity preaching point, was commissioned to the glory of God, making him the third minister from the district. Also Mr. Daniel

Dankyi Addo, the first clerk of the district has been candidated into the ordained ministry of the church this year to the Glory of God. Three caretakers in the person of Mrs. Naomi Nartey, Mrs. Hannah Gyimah Ackah and Mr. Andrews Agyei have completed and graduated from their trainings at Ga Presbytery and Abetifi respectively. In the coming year, Mr. Michael Nkansah, the caretaker of the CP Preaching Point is scheduled to undergo training.

Faithfully Departed

Sad as it was, the death of senior Abronoma Nyarko, the former vibrant senior presbyter of the Christ the King Congregation who was a member of session was reported and subsequently proven to be true. His burial was one of sober reflection and mourning. May he continue to rest well.

- **MAJOR CHALLENGES**

Since most of the congregations and preaching points are young, and still in construction phases of their chapels, it has brought financial constraints on the district.

- **APPRECIATION**

Our appreciation goes to the presbytery chairperson and his officers, all members of the Ablekuma District, the various Agents, sessions and IMC'S, group executives past and present who have helped in the work all this while.
