## **ACTIVITIES**

### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND EVENTS**

#### **ADMINISTRATION AND HUMAN RESOURCE**

##### **a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)**

1. To provide adequate training for Agents, Caretakers, Presbyters, IMC members, Worship and Group Leaders.

##### **b) Strategies**

1. A day's training workshop was organized for all Agents, Caretakers, Senior Presbyters, Clerks and Treasurers on Sunday February 16, 2025 with Presbytery auditor as the resource person. 31 people participated.
2. Two Caretakers have completed Lay Ministerial Training at Ramseyer Training Center Abetifi and they were consecrated on 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 at Christ Family Congregation North Kaneshie.

##### **c) Way Forward**

1. To organize training workshops for Agents, Presbyters and group leaders.
2. To organize seminar on records keeping and report writing for Clerks and Group Secretaries.

#### **PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT, BUILDING AND PROPERTIES**

##### **a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)**

1. To acquire lands for construction of pavilion and chapel for Preaching Points that are without a place of worship.
2. To acquire proper documents for all the lands and landed properties of the Congregations and the Preaching Points.
3. To insure landed properties with Trinity Insurance Brokers (TIB).

##### **b) Strategies**

1. Construction of a pavilion and two chapels are under way at Agortikope, and Dome Faase.

##### **c) Way Forward**

1. To acquire land for Kofikwei, Soldier Land, Botokorowa, Fankyinekor, Twerebo and Dome Sampahman.
2. To construct at least one chapel.

#### **CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE**

##### **a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)**

1. To mobilize the Congregations and Preaching Points for effective and vibrant worship.
2. To ensure that all statutory celebrations are observed.

3. To ensure that all the generational and service groups are functioning well.

**b) Strategies**

1. Some of the Generational and Service groups at the District level are up and doing well.
2. Most of the Congregations and some Preaching Points have observed the statutory celebrations as scheduled on the almanac.
3. The District Choir, Boys and Girls brigade, etc. are growing steadily.

**c) Way Forward**

1. To have well organized groups and effective church service in all the Preaching Points.
2. To ensure that, the preaching points without generational groups will start some.

## **DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

**a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)**

1. To mobilize, manage and use all available resources; human, finance and material
2. Support the less privileged in the church and community.
3. To create awareness on nature and environmental protection.

**b) Strategies**

1. The Prince of peace Children service visited the children's and emergency wards of the Ga West Municipal Assembly Hospital on Saturday December 13, 2025 and donated food items and some essentials, they shared the gospel, sung and prayed with patients, their families, and the staff.
2. Dome Sampahman Preaching Point organized free health screening for the church and the community. The screening consisted of Eye, general health care, sugar and blood tests with sophisticated machines for detection of sickness on September 9, 2025
3. We visited most final year students in their respective schools.
4. The Ramseyer Congregation, Medie and Hope Congregation Akotoshie No. 1 respectively supported members whose goods were destroyed during the Kantamanto fire outbreak early this year.
5. Talk on Hypertension Health screening for members especially on Hepatitis B
6. Vocational products fair was organized to create an awareness of what some members trade in, for patronization.

**c) Way Forward**

To visit the Health Care facility at Adjen Kotoku.

## **WELFARE**

**a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)**

1. To meet the needs of members and provide adequate aid to those who may need it.
2. To visit the aged, bereaved and the sick.

**b) Strategies**

1. About thirteen (13) children who are members of Dome Sampahman and Dome Faase Preaching Points are on full scholarship.
2. The sick, aged and bereaved were often visited and supported as well.

c) Way Forward

The welfare will look at other policies that will broaden its system of operation basically; on education, skill training and scholarship.

## SCHOLARSHIP

a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)

1. To identify brilliant but less privileged students and help them.
2. Providing full or partial scholarship to members.

b) Strategies:

1. Most of the locals (congregations and preaching Points) identified some children who have challenges in their education and assisted them.
2. Dome Sampahman has put about eight (8) children on scholarship scheme; six children from Dome Sampahman and two from Dome Faase are beneficiaries. Three of the children have got admission into Senior High Schools.

c) Way Forward

Other locals will identify a suitable scholarship scheme for their members.

## ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS

a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)

1. To organize all the church to begin local council of churches within the Adjen Kotoku community and other communities within the District.
2. To strengthen our existing relations with the Christian churches and Islamic communities.

b) Strategies

1. The Young Peoples Guide (YPG) organized interdenominational fun games with the sister churches.
2. We visited all the churches and sold the idea of the Local Council of churches to them, putting across its significance.
3. Homowo Prayer and Thanksgiving Service; The chief and the elders of Aklekwei Kwarteman together with Adjen Kotoku and the local council of churches organized Homowo prayers and thanksgiving service at Kwarteman durbar grounds on Monday August 18, 2025. Rev. Samuel Asare – Nkansah led a prayer session on the topic (*VULNERABILITY*). Apostle Patrick Annan the residence pastor of the church of the Living God Preached. Jonathan Adjamah Lartey the District Clerk of Adjen Kotoku Presby church dedicated the offering.

4. The prince of peace congregation visited three traditional heads of Adjen Kotoku to support the 2025 Homowo festival. They donated packs of bottled water and envelope with undisclosed amount.

c) Way Forward

1. To organize a royal service for all Traditional Leaders and other Churches within the District.
2. To foster good relationship with the Islamic communities.
3. To be the foremost organizer of effective local council of churches in the Adjen Kotoku community.

## **EDUCATION**

a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI).

1. To raise the image of the Presbyterian Basic and Municipal Assembly Schools.
2. To motivate and educate students with sound doctrine and academic excellence to enable them to compete with others in all aspects of their lives.
3. To render adequate help and support to students.

b) Strategies

1. Hundred and twenty children were support with Books, Pens, Pencils and Mathematical set at the beginning of the term.
2. Monthly mock examination was organized for students preparing for the Basic Education Certificate Examination; both Presbyterian and non - Presbyterian students within the district participated in it. It was held at Ramseyer congregation. The tutors were GES trained teachers.
3. Guidance and counseling were organized for students struggling in their academics.
4. Vacation classes were organized for senior high students on vacation to keep their minds refreshed and active. The four core subjects were taught and teachers from some Senior High Schools were the resource persons who took the students through.

c) Way Forward

1. The Session of the Prince of Peace congregation and the School Management Committee (SMC) and staff of the Adjen Kotoku Presbyterian school shall collaborate to support it to achieve greater success.
2. To start campus ministry in the Adjen Kotoku Senior High school (AKOSEC) and NAVS Secondary Technical Schools.

## **FINANCE**

a) Key Performance Indicators (KPI)

1. To mobilize all monies received from the locals, keep accurate records and be accountable.
2. To raise funds for the projects of the District.
3. To audit all congregations and preaching points' account for quality control.

b) Strategies

Funds were raised through Percentage Contribution System (PCS) and special offering collected to run the District projects and activities by some Congregations and Preaching Points.

c) Way Forward

The locals shall pay much attention to the PCS and fulfill their obligations on time.

### **MISSION AND EVANGELISM**

a) Key Performance Indicator (KPI)

1. To mobilize the district for evangelism and outreach programs.
2. To ensure both physical and spiritual growth.
3. To continue the market and Northern Outreach Programs (NOP)

b) Strategies

1. The Ga West Bible Study and Prayer Group (BSPG) organized House -to – House evangelism at Botokorowa, Fankyinekor and Twerebo on Sunday December 21, 2025. 25 people from all the districts with the presbytery participated.
2. Ministering in the ghettos, we organized ghetto evangelism in some ghettos within the district, this was organized by the Junior Youth and session of the Ramseyer congregation Medie.
3. Street evangelism was organized in the Adjen Kotoku, Agortikope and Akotoshie No. 2 principal streets by the children in the month of June as part of the National Children Service Evangelism month program held in June, 2025.
4. The Paanor Preaching Point together with the Kaneshie congregation organized a day open air crusade at the Paanor Okada station on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2025. Nine (9) souls were won for Christ.
5. The Ramseyer congregation organizes House – to - House evangelism every last Sunday of the month.
6. Youth in Evangelism, The Junior Youth of Ramseyer Congregation and North Dobro Preaching Point Organized Evangelism and sports with Blue Skies Company on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2025 at Blue Skies Park.

a) Way Forward

1. To raise and nurture a competent evangelism team to supervise evangelism activities.
2. To fully commence Northern Outreach Program (NOP)

1. To the glory of God fourteen (14) children were baptized at Botokorowa Preaching Point on Sunday March 23, 2025 by Rev. Samuel Asare – Nkansah.


