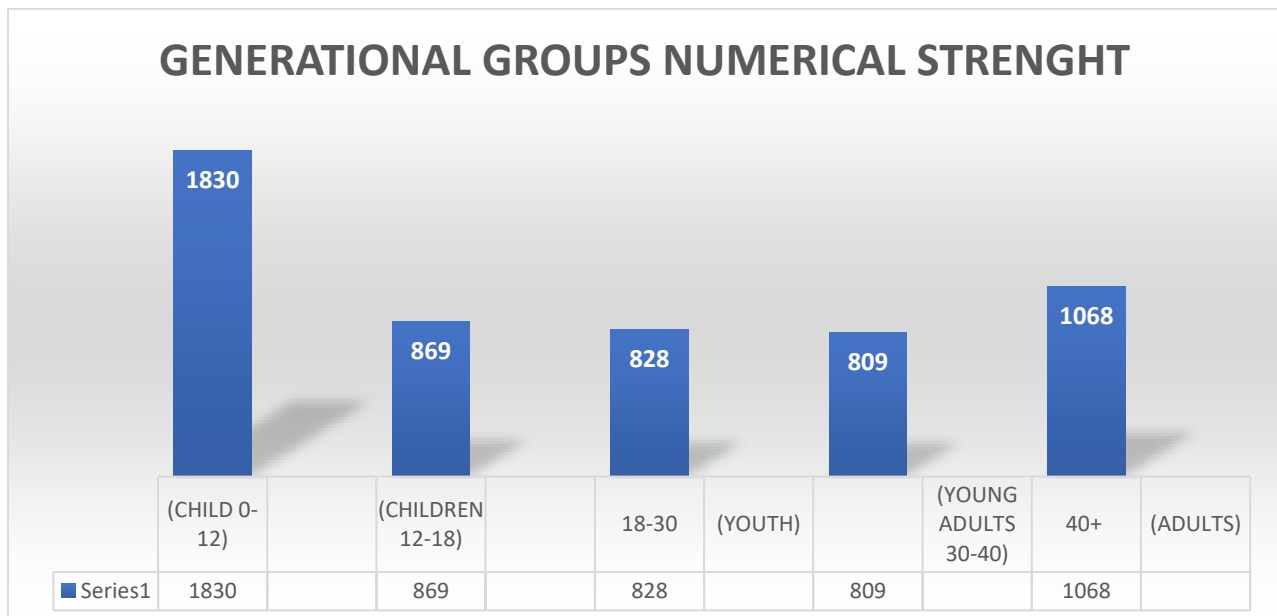
4.0 STATISTICS

A BAR GRAPH SHOWING THE STRENGTH OF GENERATIONAL GROUPS IN THE DISTRICT

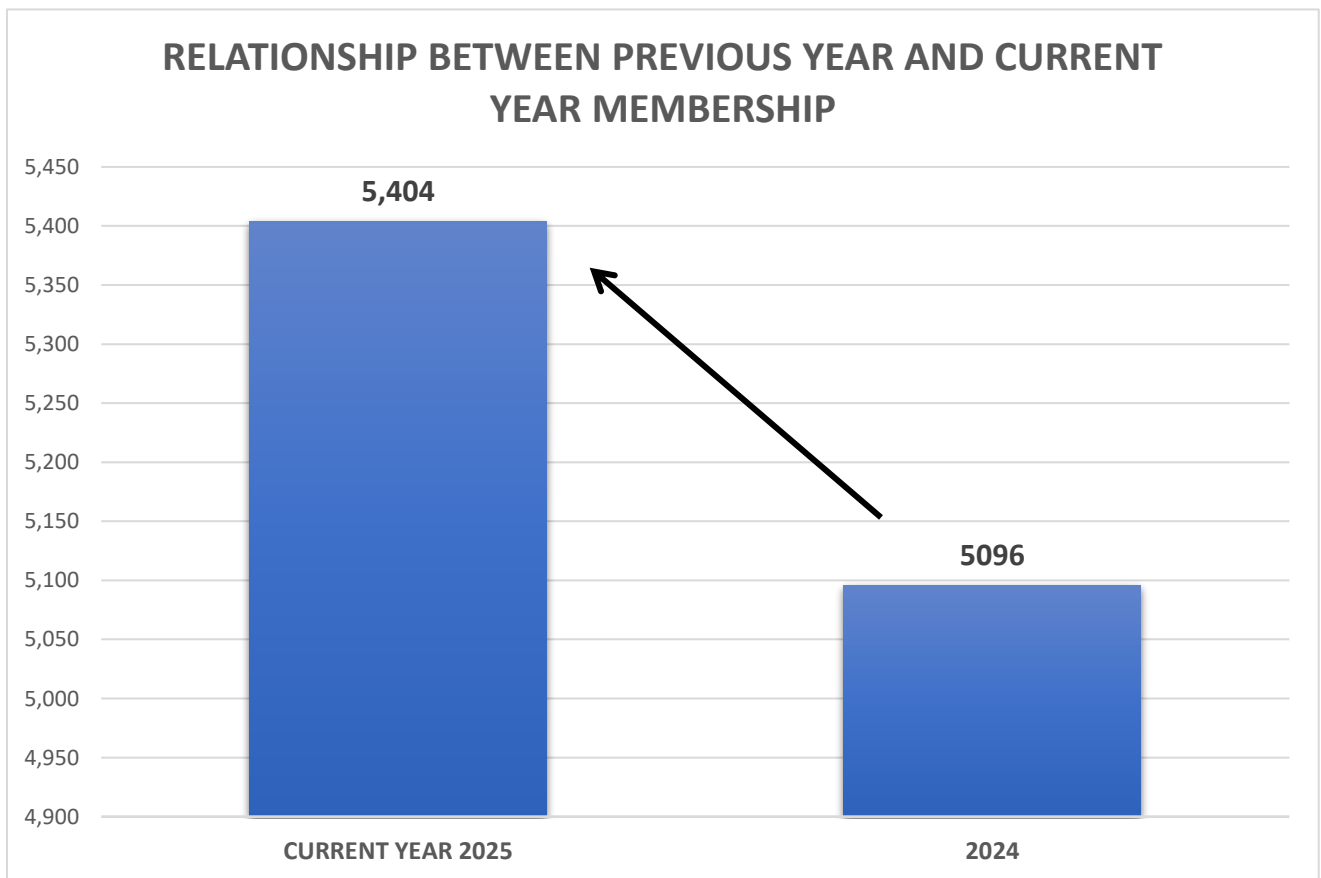


The bar graph illustrating the strength of generational groups in the District reveals that children under 12 years old constitute the largest demographic, followed by adults aged 40 and above.

This trend suggests a promising future for the District, given the significant number of young members. However, there's a notable decline in growth from Children's Service to Junior Youth, indicating a need for increased focus on children (12-18years).

4.2 A BAR GRAPH SHOWING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN LAST YEAR STATISTICS AND CURRENT YEAR STATISTICS.

To the glory of God, The District has witnessed a substantial increase in membership, growing from **5,096 in 2024 to 5,404 as of December 31, 2025**. This represents a growth rate of approximately 6.04%, a testament to the District's efforts in outreach and evangelism. The District could not achieve the 10% growth due to the demarcation of Trust Cong. to Manhean District.



5.0 HIGHLIGHTS ON THE KEY AREAS

5.1 MISSION AND EVANGELISM

The District's mission and evangelism efforts were multifaceted, with various activities aimed at spreading the gospel and strengthening Congregations. Cat. Samuel Maafo Lartey was appointed as the Coordinator.

5.2.1 Subject:

- A. To intensify evangelism through planting of one church.
- B. To increase the membership growth of the district.
- C. To strengthen two Preaching Points established last year.

5.2.3 Activities:

- A. The Two (2) Preaching points established last year were strengthened by providing Caretakers, hosting the Emmaus Day celebration and the Asempatrew.
- B. Evangelism Consultation was held on the 16th November, to prepare members for 'Asempatrew'
- C. Locals were encouraged to have a vibrant and outgoing evangelism team

D. The Evangelism Week was observed by all locals from Monday, 2nd to Friday 6th June 2025 under the *Theme, "Celebrating our Heritage: faithfulness in Stewardship"*. There were evangelism activities like house to house, visitation and street evangelism among others.

5.2.1 Subject:

A. The Emmaus Day Celebration took place on Easter Monday at Akramaman 37 Preaching point. Members from the Nineteen (19) locals within the Amasaman District came together for the celebration. Some events that took place includes, Bible Quiz, Sack Race, Soccer.

Early morning evangelism was conducted at Akramaman 37 & Otuaplern resulting in 10 souls being won.

AMASAMAN 3RD YEAR ANNIVERSARY

To the glory of God, Amasaman marked its 3-year anniversary on June 26th and celebrated in remarkable style.

The Amasaman District's 3-year anniversary celebration featured the following activities:

1. Each local launched the 3rd Anniversary at their respective locals with prayers said for the District and PCG.
2. Street/Market Evangelism: A Street evangelism event was organized in the Amasaman vicinity, specifically at the Rural Bank, on 26th July, 2025
3. Thanksgiving/Change of Pulpit: The anniversary celebration climaxed on the 10th August, 2025 with a "Change of Pulpit" event, which aimed to raise funds to support the District Manse on 10th August, 2025

A. POSTINGS

NEWLY POSTED MINISTERS TO THE DISTRICT

II. The Rev. retired Alexander Adu Sekyere who was attached to Achiaman, Royal Congregation due to the illness of the Rev. Elvis Nartey as Caretaker Minister was sent off in a grand service of honour.

B. EVANGELISM AND CHURCH PLANTING

I. As part of the celebration of Amasaman @ 3 Anniversary celebration, the District organized many activities, remarkable was street Evangelism at the Streets of Amasaman Rural Bank and Market areas held on 26th July, 2025. The attendance was encouraging, with ten (10) souls were won to the glory of God, and they are being followed up.

II. A mega District Prayer Retreat was organized on Holy Saturday, at Eben-Ezer Congregation, Amasaman. The District YAF also organized a mega Prayer Retreat in October to revamp the YAF

III. The Emmaus Day Celebration of the Amasaman District took place on Easter Monday, at Ayikai Doblo. The program featured evangelism at Akramaman 37, float and games.

IV. The Evangelism Week was observed by all locals from June 13-19, 2025, activities included house-to-house evangelism, visitation, and dawn broadcasting.

The YPG organized "The Pulpit," a preaching competitive program within the District. The program featured Junior Youth (JY) members preaching the Word of God. Liberty Congregation, Akramamann emerged as the winner at the end of the program.

F. DISTRICT MANSE BUILDING

By the grace of God, the four-bedroom Manse has been roofed, and interior and exterior works are ongoing. I entreat all locals to support this cause with their commitments effectively.

H. CHRISTMAS STREET PARTY

Majority of the Congregations organized a grand street party. Approximately 300 people were fed with food and drinks.

13.0 CHALLENGES

- A. We request that the Presbytery support some of our Preaching points who worshipped under sheds and have land issues
- B. Difficulty in mobilizing funds to support preaching points with plots of lands.

14.0 PROJECTIONS

1. To embark on an all-inclusive massive evangelism targeting an organic annual growth of 20% to 30%. Strategies to achieve this include:
 - Setting up a functional evangelism committee headed by an Agent.
 - Implementing an outreach program for one-on-one, door-to-door personal evangelism.
 - Visiting nearby schools and hospitals.
 - Organizing a Street Party for the destitute within the year.
2. To plant an additional Preaching Point in the District.
3. To partner with Districts in residential urban areas to support acquiring land for planting more churches.
4. To elevate two Preaching Points to Congregational Status in 2026.

15.0 FAITHFULLY DEPARTED

With the sure hope of the resurrection of believers, two (2) presbyters were called to eternity in the year under review.

16.0 CONCLUSION

The Amasaman District is ever grateful to the Almighty God for seeing us through yet another year successfully, and increasing our membership growth to **6.04%** as at **31st December, 2025**.

We pray the good Lord will continue to order our steps and grant us wisdom and strength to be able to work in His vineyard.



