RETIREMENT

Two Catechists within the District are due for retirement in 2026. Cat. Ernestina Akuye Bonsu, Catechist with a Charge at Prince of Peace Congregation, in July 2026 and Cat. Alexander Ansah Sakyi, Catechist in Charge of Faith Preaching Point, in September, 2026. The District is planning successful valedictory services for both of them.

3.1.3 Planned Activity

- Training on Strategic Plan for all Agents, Clerks and IC's
- Training on Sermon Preparation and Delivery
- Agents' Quarterly Meetings
- Marriage Talk
- JY Excursion, Games
- Organize Bible Quiz for the Junior Youth Ministry

3.1.4 Objective

- For Agents, Clerks and IC's to get conversant with the Strategic Plan reporting style.
- To equip Agents on proper sermon preparation and delivery
- To discuss issues affecting Agents and the various locals and ways to curb them
- To help address challenges in marriages of congregants.
- To foster unity amongst both the JY members and teachers within the District.
- To prepare the JY members for the Presbytery Zonal Quiz.

3.1.5 Results of Planned Activity

- On 26th April, the District organized a training programme for all Agents, Clerks and IC's; however attendance was not encouraging. The District Lay Representative, Mr. John Oppong was the Resource Person for the day. He took participants through how to input information and how to report with the Strategic Plan Software. Responses from members were very positive, asking for the programme to be re-organized.
- On 17th May, a training programme was organized for all Agents on Sermon Preparation and Delivery. The programme was well attended by the Agents. The Resource Persons were; the District Minister, Rev. Kingsley Aidoo, Rev. Freda Dwomoh Piesie and Rev. Alfred Adama Oblitey.
- Four quarterly Agents' meetings were held in February, April, July and November, to discuss pertinent issues affecting Agents and Locals, and Agents Welfare. These meetings have really helped Agents on how to address issues and how to handle congregants in their various locals.
- On 17th August, the Bethel Mt. View Congregation organized a marriage seminar with some legal experts. The programme which was well attended addressed issues of divorce and remarriage.
- The District Bible Quiz was attended by 75 JY members and 10 Leaders from all over the District. Participants who contested from the various locals were presented with certificates and medals after the quiz.

3.1.6 Remarks

- Talk on Marriage was met with immense enthusiasm from members, who actively participated by asking thoughtful questions. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with many members requesting follow-up sessions to further explore this critical topic.
- Attendance, participation and contribution for the marriage retreat were massive.
- The Bible quiz was successful and the winners represented the District at the Presbytery Zonal level

3.2.0 MISSION AND EVANGELISM (M&E)

3.2.1 Plan Activity

3.2.3. Objective

- To establish a church at Pentecost Junction in the Fise District as per a Presbytery Session Decision.
- To build members' spiritual life through prayers and to win souls for the various zones.
- To equip and encourage members for soul winning within the District.
- To continue reviving the Kuwait Preaching Point
- To thank God for the number of years of existence and also create awareness of the Aplaku District in the vicinity and lastly, to win souls for the Church

3.2.4. Result of Planned Activity

- **District Evangelism Consultation** came off on October 11, 2025. Congregations were represented by Agents, Clerks and Mission and Evangelism Coordinators to report on key outreach programmes conducted with results and impact, report on evangelistic activities target for 2026-2027 and report on membership growth. About 30 participants attended. The programme was successful. The Resource Persons for the programme were the District Minister, the District Lay Representative and the District Clerk.
- **Prayer Convention:** The three-day Convention took place at the three zonal heads; Grace, Prince of Peace and Nyomo Dromo Congregations, respectively. The programme commenced from Wednesday 17th to Friday 19th September, 2025 at 6:30pm each night. Speakers for the Convention were Rev. Alfred Adama Oblitey for the Central Zone, Rev. Nicholas Ayikwei Aryee, Western Zone and Cat. Elvis Dela Anku for the Coastal Zone. In all, 250 members participated within the three zones.

- **Church Planting;** as per a directive from the Ga West Presbytery, the Aplaku District was tasked to plant a church at Fise, Pentecost junction, Amanfrom.

Some feasibility studies were embarked upon by the District Minister and Catechists Florence Nyarko Addy, Sampson Akwei, Samuel Eduah and the District Clerk, Cat. Elvis Dela Anku, in September, 2025.

A two-day exercise comprising house-to-house evangelism, tract sharing and film show was embarked upon from Friday 3rd to Saturday 4th October, 2025. The first Church service was held on 5th October, 2025. Since it was Worldwide Communion Sunday, Holy Communion was administered.

Four children, one JY member and a woman attended service on the day. In all, **12** people, including the Evangelism Team, attended church that day. The name “**Bethel**” was given to the Preaching Point and handed over to a member of the team by name Mr. William Nii Lamptey from Bethel Mt. View Congregation. Currently average membership is **20**.

- **2025 Church Extension.** A three-day film show and house-to-house evangelism was organized as part of the District Session activities at Kuwait and its environs to continue reviving the Kuwait Preaching Point from 20th to 22nd January, 2026. About 25 members took part in this exercise. Many people who were visited in their houses accepted the Gospel.
- **Jesus Street Party** came off on 26th December, 2025. Food and other items like clothing and Gospel tracts were given out. The outreach covered a slum, Old Barrier and Block Factory Junction Taxi Ranks, some squatters at Aplaku Top and GICEL Police Cells. In all about 80 people were fed.
- As part of the District 10th Anniversary programme, a Float and Street Evangelism was organized on 29th November, 2025 within the environs of the District Head, Grace Congregation. Members attended in their numbers to share tracts and display placards with salvation messages amidst brass band music.

Still as part of the 10th Anniversary, the District visited the female section of the Nsawam Medium Security Prison on Friday 23rd January, 2026 to donate food items, toiletries and sanitary pads to inmates, while presenting the Gospel to them. The programme was well attended and it was successful.

- **Health Walk, Police Cells and Street Evangelism:** In collaboration with the Men's Fellowship, the Committee organized a community health walk with aerobics and street evangelism on 14th June, 2025 to engage the public and to share the Gospel. The Grace Congregation BSPG and Mission and Evangelism Committee conducted quarterly visits to the GICEL Police Cells, ministering to inmates through prayer and the Word of God. The last one was held on the 26th December, 2025.

3.2.5 Remarks

- The District Evangelism Consultation was encouraging, as members were equipped for evangelism; presentations by the various locals were good.
- Attendance to the District Prayer Convention at all the three zones for the three-day programme was massive.
- 2025 Church Extension programme was very successful.
- Police Cells Visitations were lively and successful. Inmates genuinely received the Word of God as they danced to our hymns.

3.3.0. FINANCE

3.3.1. Planned Activity

- District forwarded weekly returns to the higher courts
- Statutory Day payments were made
- Training for Treasurers on how to report with the new Presbytery Financial Policy.

3.3.2. Objective

- This will help forward returns to Presbytery and Head Office
- That all statutory payments be made to the higher courts
- That Treasures be acquainted with the new Presbytery directive on financial policy

3.3.4. Result of Planned Activity

- All financial commitments to higher courts were fully covered in the year under review
- The training programme was well attended by the Treasurers.

3.4.0. CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE (CLAN)

3.4.1. Planned Activity

- Inauguration of Congregations
- To organize meetings for past and present Presbyters
- Planning towards District 10th Anniversary celebration
- To organize Presbyters' Elections in some Congregations
- Induction of District Group Executives

3.4.2. Objective

- To inaugurate two Preaching Points to full congregational status.
- To revive the Presbyters' Conference at the Local level.
- To celebrate the District 10th Anniversary in January 2026.
- To replace Presbyters whose tenure in office had ended.
- To induct new District Group Executives into office.

3.4.3. Result of Planned Activity

- Empowerment and Peniel Preaching Points were inaugurated to Congregational status on 12th and 26th October, 2025 respectively. The act of inauguration was conducted by Rev. Kingsley Aidoo, the District Minister and was assisted by Cat. Elvis Dela Anku, the District Clerk of Session and Mr. John Oppong, the District Lay Rep. Two more Preaching Points; Mt. Olivet-Adanseman and Bethel-Bortianor, are due for inauguration in 2026.
- On Presbyters' Conference, three meetings were held with the aim of strengthening the Conference at the local level. Average attendance to all the meetings ranged between 50 and 60.
- As part of the District 10th Anniversary celebration the following programmes took place:
 1. A Forum on Aplaku's Past, Present and Future was held at the Prince of Peace Congregation on 18th October, 2025. This educative and insightful seminar was led by Mrs. Joyce Quagraine. She educated members about how the Aplaku District came into being, where we are now and the future.
 2. District Carols and Praise Service came off on 13th of December, 2025 at Bethel Mt. View Congregation, Tuba, with the various District Singing Groups and the Bethel Mt. View Praise Team performing on the night.
- Grace and Zion Congregations as well as Empowerment and Faith Preaching Points elected new Presbyters. All the newly elected Presbyters have been duly commissioned.
- Newly elected Executives of the District Singing Band, Men's Fellowship, Women's Fellowship and Young People's Guild were also inducted into office.

3.4.4 Remarks

All the programmes were successful and well participated.

3.5.0. DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES (DSS)

3.5.1. Planned Activity

- To organize clean-up activities
- To provide free medical screening for congregants after Sunday divine services

3.5.2. Objective

- To keep our environments clean as a church

- To help members know their health status and maintain healthy lifestyle

3.5.3. Result of Planned Activity

- Although the various District Groups were encouraged to organise clean-up exercises during their almanac week celebrations with the aim of keeping the environment clean, attendance was poor. The District will however continue to stress on the need for the Groups to help clean our environment for healthy life.
- The Grace Congregation continues to provide free medical screening dubbed Mini Clinic, in order for congregants to maintain healthy lifestyles. Averagely, about 150 members patronize the facility every month.

3.6. Remarks

All the programmes were successful. The District will continue to encourage other congregations to organize more social intervention programmes in their communities.

4.0. ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS (ESR)

4.1. Planned Activity

- To build a healthy relationship with our Muslim brothers to ensure peace in our community
- To build a good relationship with our Chiefs, Queens and other Traditional Leaders.

4.3. Result of Planned Activity

- Efforts were made to visit our Muslim brothers during their Ramadan fasting and prayers, however, the District was advised to reschedule for another time.

4.4. Remarks

The visit to the Mosque did not come on as initially scheduled. The District is planning to embark on such visits at least twice before December 2026

4.0. EDUCATION

4.1 Planned Activity

- To organize District Bible Quiz and Spelling Bee for the youth
- To visit JY members in Senior High Schools
- To support needy students

4.2 Objective

- To enlighten the Junior Youth on Bible knowledge and to improve cordial relationship amongst them.
- To educate the JY members on Presbyterian discipline, our heritage, core values and mandate as a Church.

4.3 Result of Planned Activity

- About 80 JY members and 20 Leaders from nine Congregations participated in the District Bible Quiz and Spelling Bee programme. Certificates were given to the best three Congregations.
- Congregations visited their JY members in some Senior High Schools with cash donations and provisions.
- Most Congregations also gave partial scholarships to support needy students in both Junior and Senior High Secondary Schools.

4.4 Remarks

All the programmes were successful. All students were also very happy with the support they received to aid their studies.

7.0. NOTABLE EVENTS

- The Aplaku District celebrated its 10th Anniversary in the year under review but in moderation. The thanksgiving service coincided with the District Session Sunday on 25th January, 2026 at the Nyomo Dromo Congregation, Kokrobite.
- By the grace of God, Mr. Isaac Azu Tetteh from Bethel Mountain View Congregation, gained admission to the Special Ministerial Training (**SMT**) in Abetifi.

8.0 CHALLENGES

- The need to purchase a bus for evangelism and as an income generating venture
- The need to purchase lands and build pavilions for Mawuko, Faith and Bethel (Fise) Preaching Points.
