4.0 THE DISTRICT SESSION COUNCIL

4.1 Meetings

The District Session Council (DSC) held three scheduled quarterly meetings during the period. The first was on Thursday, 20th March, 2025; the second on Thursday, 31st July, 2025; the third took place on Saturday, 25th October, 2025; and the fourth held on Wednesday, 3rd December, 2025. The attendance for the four meetings were **40, 50, 45 and 38 out of the expected 80 members** respectively indicating an average attendance of 43.

The above poor meeting attendance resulted in a change of the meeting day from Thursday evening to Saturday. Irrespective of the change, the attendance has still not been encouraging.

A number of issues and decisions submitted by the DSCSC were discussed and ratified where necessary.

5.2 Meetings

In line with the PCG Constitution, the DSCSC met twelve (12) times on a monthly basis on scheduled dates, usually the third Thursday of each month: Thursday, 15th May, 2025; Thursday, 19th June, 2025; Thursday, 17th July, 2025; Thursday, 21st August, 2025; Thursday, 18th September, 2025; Thursday, 16th October, 2025; and Thursday, 13th November, 2025.

As part of its core mandate, the DSCSC met to deal with issues on behalf of the DSC, remitted decisions to the DSC for ratification and then addressed decisions remitted to it.

6.1 Congregational/Preaching Points Statistics

Analysis of the data presented above indicates the following:

- Two Preaching Points grew above the minimum target of 10%.
- All the other Congregations and Preaching Points experienced meagre digits of growth though they still fall below the 10% rate expectation.
- The year under review recorded a percentage growth of **5.0%** as compared to **9.1%** of the year, 2024.

This is an indication that as a District, there is the need for us to enhance our evangelistic activities; and keep good records on the souls won during these activities, accompanied with

effective follow-up. On behalf of the District Session, I would like to encourage the Congregations that grew only marginal or performed averagely than last year to work harder to add to their numbers, especially through evangelism in their immediate environs.

I would also like to urge that Agents, who are responsible for signing the “Form C” of their various Congregations and Preaching Points to ensure that the recorded figures are authentic and represent the accurate membership data. This is even more critical if they (the Agents) have not been personally involved in their compilations.

A critical study of the correlation between the three tables; **Congregations and Preaching Points, Statistics for District Groups and the Average Church Attendance**, tells a precarious story about the membership of the Church which needs to be seriously addressed. I believe that the Group to discuss this report would come out with recommendations to that effect.

7.0 KEY RESULTS AREAS

7.1 ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS (ESR)

a) NEW YEAR SERVICE WITH NII WIABO I

Objectives

To contribute to promoting peace in the vicinity through acknowledging God's presence for the gift of life.

Activity

On Sunday, 19th January 2025, the District organized a New Year Thanksgiving Service at Wiaboman.

Results:

In attendance was Nii Wiabo I and his subjects to grace the service. Nii Wiabo I, based on the outcome (attendance) of the service instituted an annual thanksgiving Service for the Township to be led by the District.

Remarks

The program was successfully organized with massive participation from all invited Churches and dignitaries within the Wiaboman Township.

b) VISIT TO THE CHIEF PALACE

Objectives

To fractionize with the Traditional Authorities within the Mpoasei & Wiaboman environs.

Activity

- i. On Friday, 26th December, 2025, the District paid a courtesy call to the Mpoasei & Wiaboman Chief's Palaces.
- ii. The District reached out to the Traditional Rulers within the District.

Results:

In attendance was Nii Wiabo & the Mpoasei Chief, the District and his subjects to grace the service during the visit.

Remarks:

The visit was successfully organized with encouraged participation from the District and dignitaries within the Mpoasei & Wiaboman township.

7.2 MISSION & EVANGELISM (M&E)

a) ASHALAJA-POLICE FARMS OUTREACH

Objectives:

To evangelize through an outreach on weekly basis within the catchment area of Ashalaja-Police Farms.

Activity:

On Sunday, 23rd March, 2025, the District commenced its evangelism outreach at Ashalaja-Police Farms to erupt a new Preaching Point. The exercise conducted so far was based on House to House and Street Evangelism.

Results:

A total of **179 souls** were contacted, out of which new converts stand **31. 9 Adults** and **22 Children** had fully started a Peaching Point by name PCG Bethel Preaching Point, Ashalaja. **17** people out of the **31** led to receive Christ, were baptized.

Remarks:

The past weekly outreaches were successfully organized and carried out with massive

involvement from all the representatives from the various congregations within the District.

b) DISTRICT CHURCH EXTENSION – PHASE 1

Objectives:

To evangelize through an outreach within the catchment areas (Ebenezer Down Station, Dansoman Main Roundabout, Exhibition Down, Market, Keep Fit, Gbegbeyise, Karikari Down-Mamponse, Atomic, Beach Road & New Mamprobi) of all the locals within the District to spread the Gospel and reunite with the lost souls.

Activity:

The underlined outreach activities were organized from Monday, 8th to Wednesday, 10th December, 2025. They include;

- i. Street/Open Evangelism
- ii. House to House Evangelism

Results:

All Locals in collaboration with M&E Committee Members joined forces to execute the task successfully and reached out to 50 souls within their catchment areas of which 20 were old members and 30, new members.

Remarks:

Attendance was encouraging which contributed to the task being successfully carried out.

c) DISTRICT CHURCH EXTENSION – PHASE 2

Objectives:

To evangelize through an outreach within the catchment areas of the host church Nazareth Congregation, spread the Gospel and reunite with the lost souls.

Activity:

The outreach activity organized for the final 2 days was solely crusade and the dates were 11th & 12th December, 2025 respectively. This exercise brought all the District Groups & Members together as well as old souls under one umbrella.

Results:

Attendance was very encouraging which contributed to the task being successfully carried out.

7.3 CHURCH, LIFE AND NURTURE (CLAN)

a) EMMAUS DAY-FUN GAMES

Objectives:

- i. To keep both the young and old very fit and to encourage them to socialize more in order to know each other.
- ii. To evangelize through sports.

Activities:

- i. The District organized an Inter-Congregational Fun game on Emmaus Day, Monday 21st April, 2025 at PCG, Emmanuel Congregation's premises.
- ii. A House-to-House evangelism was also organized same day prior to the fun games. 21 individuals were reached out to but they are yet to join the Church.
- iii. Various games were incorporated and they include; *Volleyball, Table Tennis, Play Cards, Oware, Ludu, Kids PlayStation, Video Games, Lime & Spoon, Sack Race*

Remarks:

- i. Participation in various activities was very encouraging. It was also well attended.

b) CHRISTMAS STREET PARTY

Objectives:

- i. To foster a sense of community and bring neighbours together in a festive, relaxed environment.
- ii. To spread joy and create positive relationships among residents who may not interact regularly in their daily life.

Activities:

- i. During the festive period dated 25th December, 2025, the District organized a street party for over 6,500 children and community members.
- ii. The District also reached out to habitats in the various localities.

Remarks:

- i. Participation was very encouraging. It was also well attended. A lot of people were reached out to.

7.4 EDUCATION (EDU)

SUBJECT INTERACTION

Objectives:

To prepare the District JY BECE Candidates for their Examination.

Activities

The District organized subjects' interaction for its BECE Candidates on Saturday, 24th May, 2025 at PCG, Emmanuel Congregation's premises.

The District invited resource persons of the various subjects for the exercise. The resource persons were;

- Mrs. Vida Koranteng Odame (District Education Coordinator)
- Rev. Augustus Sakyi-Adjei (Mathematics)
- Mr. Nana Yiadom (English Language)
- Mr. Victor Kobby Kumadevie (Creative Arts)

- Mr. Ishmeal Gbenatey (Social Studies)

Remarks

Out of the **96 Candidates** expected for the Subject Interaction, only **38 Candidates** showed up to take part of the exercise. Attendance was not encouraging.

7.5 DEVELOPMENT & SOCIAL SERVICES (DSS)

a) BLOOD DONATION EXERCISE

Objectives:

To increase and replenish the blood supply in national and regional blood banks, thereby saving lives through ensuring that patients receive timely, safe, and quality blood for life-saving treatments.

Activities:

On Sunday, 27th July, 2025, the District organized Blood Donation Exercise at the PCG, Emmanuel Premises for all members to participate in order to serve the above purposes.

Remarks/Results:

The exercise was successfully carried out though only a few participated (say 15-25 members).

b) CLEAN UP EXERCISE

Objectives:

To improve environmental cleanliness and public health by removing waste and debris, which in turn promotes community spirit and church's responsibility, prevents

the spread of disease, and supports sustainable development.

This exercise enhanced the visual appeal of areas and serve as educational platforms to encourage proper waste management practices and lasting behavioral changes within the community.

Activities:

On Saturday, 9th August, 2025, the District took its cleaning exercise to the Dansoman Poly Clinic to serve the above purposes. Aside the clean-up, some cleaning materials were donated to the Clinic to further enhance their sanitation works. These items were as follows;

“Gallons of Liquid Soaps & Disinfectants, Mops & Mob Buckets, Sweeping Short Brooms, Ceiling & Scrubbing Brushes, Cobweb Remover & Dustbins, Dozens of Dusters & Standing Brooms, Bulbs, Unlimited Boxes of Nose Masks & Hand Gloves”.

Remarks/Results:

Participation was very encouraging. The exercise was well attended.

8.0 NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS/EVENTS

8.1 Transfers to the District

8.2 Induction & Introductory Services

8.3 Send-off & Valedictory Services

8.3.1 Rev. Bismark Anaba Akandi’s send-off service was held on Sunday, 24th August, 2025 at Christ Congregation, Petroleum.

8.3.2 Rev. Augustus Sakyi-Adjei’s valedictory service was held on 31st August, 2025 at PCG, Nazareth Congregation.

8.3.2 Rev. Patrick Kwesi Baah’s send-off service was also held on 7th September, 2025 at PCG, Emmanuel Congregation.

8.4 District JY BECE Candidates Trial Test & Subject Interactions

Mrs. Vida Koranteng Odame, the District Coordinator for Education supervised these activities which took place on the Saturday, 24th May, 2025. Out of the 92 candidates expected, Thirty-Eight (38) took part in the Subject Interactions. These were successfully organized though attendance was not encouraging. The ultimate goal was to fully prepare these BECE pupils to face the ultimate day of the final exams on how to approach the questions and was carried out well.

8.5 District Church Extension

The first phase of the organized activities started as a localized evangelism by creating awareness through house to house evangelism and visitation of old members from Monday 8th December, 2025 through to Wednesday, 10th December, 2025, by the various churches within the District and Nazareth Congregation being the host. It then continued with an in-church mega crusade from Thursday, 11th to Friday, 12th December, 2025 at Nazareth

Church premises and all congregations were in attendance. Thanksgiving Service took place at Nazareth Congregation. Old souls were revived and new ones won yet follow ups are being made.

10. CHALLENGES

Unfortunately, most of these challenges hindered the progress of work, meeting deadlines and slowed down activities facilitation. It is my prayer that the leaders of the various sectors and Groups would consider it as their Christian stewardship obligation to tackle the underlisted challenges to the glory of the Lord.

The challenges are as follows:

- Late submission of reports from Congregational Clerks to the District office makes it difficult for the office to meet deadline of submitting to the Presbytery.
- The attendance to the District's invitation to Congregations and Preaching Points for Seminars and Workshops is very poor. (Report Writing and Compilation of data for FORM C & TYRP) are typical examples.
- The negative and delayed responses by Congregations, Preaching Points and Groups to decisions, correspondence and other requirements conveyed from the District Office.
- Sessions/IMCs/Groups representatives who attend meetings/seminars/workshops do not report on these events or inform members about decision/actions and other pertinent facts as expected.
- Quarterly reports on events/activities carried out within the District by Groups, Stations and other designations during the periods are not submitted accurately to the appropriate offices.
- Most often, Groups' requests (including financial, social and physical requirements for support) are lately submitted to the District Office, leaving the Office little or no time to act expeditiously or decisively on them.
- Correspondence for the Congregations and Preaching Points are not collected from the pigeon holes regularly and on time.

It is recommended that the Congregations and Preaching Points take advantage of the open doors of the District Minister and the DSCSC to discuss pertinent issues for possible solutions, advice or assistance. The long desired District Professional Guild must be operationalized to assist Congregations, Preaching Points, Groups and individuals in the District on different technical matters, including the acquisition of landed properties.

11. EMERGING/NEW STRATEGIC FOCUS

11.1 Formation of NUPS-G

The District, upon meeting on the 35th District Session, 2025 decided on the establishment of branches of the National Union of Presbyterian Students, Ghana (NUPS-G) in three institutions, namely; Methodist University College, Ebenezer Senior High School and St. Margaret Mary Senior High School. Fortunately, a seven (7) Member Committee had been formed based on a legal appointment given them dated Thursday, 17th April, 2025. The full complement of Committee Members is detailed below;
