- **Introduction**

This is a report from the Ecumenical and Social Relations Department of the Ga West Presbytery for January to December, 2025.

- **Christian Home Week 2025**

The 2025 Christian home week was celebrated across some Districts in the Presbytery. Local council of Churches activities were intensified within the week.

- **Bible week celebrations 2025**

The 2025 Bible week was celebrated under the theme "**The Holiness of God.**" Most locals organised various activities both at the congregational level and in collaboration with Local Council of Churches and the Bible Society of Ghana. We are much grateful to the Bible Society of Ghana.

- **Presbyterian Youth in Peace Project Initiative Workshop**

The Annual National workshop for the Youth in Peace Project came off successfully in Abokobi from Monday 10th November, to Friday 14th November 2025 on the theme: "**Ecological Injustice: A time bomb against the Peace and Security of Ghana**". The resource persons were **Mr. George Matey Okorley, Ing. Michael Botse Baidoo, and Mrs. Rebecca Teiko Sabah**. Some sub topics delivered were:

1. The role of PCG in addressing Ecological Injustice
2. Ecological Injustice: A “time bomb” against the Peace and Security of Ghana
3. Galamsey and the imminent water crisis in Ghana

The Presbytery was represented by Rev. Frank Letsu (ESR Director) and Mr. Edmund Yaw Anane (Youth in Peace Initiative Project Coordinator).

- **Christian Council Week and Lecture**

The Ga West Presbytery was privileged to the Christian Council of Ghana for their week celebrations and lecture at the Christ Family Congregation, North Kaneshie District.

- **Palace Ministry**

Palace Ministry activities has been enhanced in the Presbytery with most of the Districts paying a courtesy visit to their respective Palaces and presented some assorted items to them before and during the Homowo festivities and the Christmas Season.

- **Mosque Visitations**

With the dominance of Muslim communities in some parts of the Presbytery, mosque visitations have been encouraged across all Districts. During the fasting period of the Muslims, most Districts were able to visit them as well as make some donations to foster peace and development.

- **Community Engagements**

The Calvary Congregation in Weija Gbawe District, partnered with the **St. Martins Hospital** to organise a health screening outreach for members of the community. This brought together many members of other churches and faith to participate in the event.
