During the year under review, Mr. Sampson Anom, Caretaker for Amamorley Preaching Point gained admission into the Trinity Theological Seminary. Cat. Samuel Osafo Asomani replaced him as Catechist in Charge of the Amamorley Preaching Point.

OVERARCHING GOALS

- a) Membership statistics;
OG-01; The total membership grew from 3,163 to 3,390 with a variance of 227 and a percentage growth of 7.17%.
- b) OG-2 – OG-05

Meeting Reporting Deadlines

- The District submitted all its reports to the Ga-West Presbytery.
- The District Minister signed Performance Target Agreement with the Presbytery Chairperson while a similar one was signed by Agents-in-charge of Congregations within the District.
- As for committee Chairpersons and Staff, no performance Target Agreement were signed and no appraisal have been done yet. We are in the process of developing our own Performance Target Agreement and Appraisal forms.
- An Evangelism Consultation and Church Growth review was held on 14th December, 2025 at Emmanuel Congregation- Fise. Fifty-two (52) members were expected to attend the program. A total number of forty-six (46) members participated. The purpose of the program was basically to evaluate Church growth methods and to develop strategies to bring members on board for soul winning and also the re-establishment of the BSPG for Evangelism.

DEPARTMENTAL GOALS

EDUCATION

- a) Key Performance Indicators: Edu-04
- b) Strategy;
- The Fise District organized an orientation session for all the Basic Education Certificate Examination graduates to help them equip themselves with the basic knowledge needed as they prepare to go to Senior High School. Seventeen (17) children attended.
 - A pre- Senior High School classes was organized for the B.E.C.E graduates to equip them with foundational knowledge and skills for their next level of education. The Emmanuel Congregation organized this classes to offer valuable learning support to the students and reaffirm the church's commitment to their development.

CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- CLN-01& 02: There was an increase of 7.17% in our membership compared to the previous year.

- *Children Service Quizzes*: The District and zonal Bible quiz competitions for Children Service were held on 16th August, 2024 and 6th September, 2025 respectively. The Fise District qualified for the Presbytery level which was held on Saturday, 27th September, 2025 and took the fifth position.
- *Camp Meeting*: The District Young Peoples' Guild organized a camp meeting at the Pentecost Retreat Centre in Gomoa Fetteh from 19th – 21st September, 2025. Over there, they had All-night, Bible Studies, Fasting and Prayer Session, Games, Prayer Night and Thanksgiving service. This programme has become an annual ritual and they yearn to go back.
- *Inauguration and Election*: Fise District Men's Fellowship was inaugurated on the 16th of February, 2025 at the Mount Sinai Congregation. The District Men's fellowship then had their Conference and an election was organized on the 8th of November, 2025 at the Mt. Sinai Congregation.
- *Youth Rally*: On the 18th of April, 2025 the Fise District organized its first Youth Rally for the youth at the Emmanuel Congregation which was dubbed; "Recharge for the Youth Ministry" with Rev. Dr. Kofi Aidoo as the guest speaker. It was a very interactive and educative program. Two hundred and twenty-three (223) children and youth were in attendance.
- *Counselling*: Emmanuel congregation organized counselling sessions monthly to support members experiencing life's challenges. The average participants per month was twenty-four (24).
- *Music Festival*: The District Singing Band and Choir were joined by Praise Teams from the Congregations to organize the Annual Musical Festival on the 9th November, 2025. The performance was encouraging but there is still room for improvement.

ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS

a) Key Performance Indicators: ESR-01

b) Strategies;

- *The Emmanuel Congregation in collaboration with Marvels Restaurant organized a cooking competition and invited the Local Council of Churches. The event brought together churches within the community with a total of seventy (70) participants. Certificates were awarded to all participating churches.*

- *During the Homowo festival, a delegation from the Emmanuel Congregation visited the Chief and his elders and shared the gospel with them. They also made a cash donation to the Chief and his elders.*

ADMINISTRATION AND HUMAN RESOURCE

a) Key Performance Indicators:

AHRM-1: Agents and Congregational Clerks and IC's had a day training on the Three Year Rolling Plan.

Strategy;

- *Training on strategic planning:* A training on the Three Year Rolling Plan was organized by the District for all Agents, Clerks, Implementation Coordinators and Administrators on the 1st of June, 2025 at Emmanuel congregation (Fise). A total of Thirty (30) people were in attendance.
- A Functionaries training was organized by the District for all Agents, Sermon Preachers, Service Leaders and Bible Readers on 25th January, 2025 at Emmanuel congregation (Fise). A total of seventy-five people were in attendance.

DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES

a) Key Performance Indicators: DSS-03

b) Strategy;

- A clean up exercise was organized by Emmanuel Congregation to clean the church, its environs as well as the Fise community. The exercise fostered communal spirit, enhanced sanitation and reflected the church's commitment to both spiritual and physical wellbeing.
- Health talks were organized by the Good Shepherd Congregation on the 6th, 7th and 8th of August, 2025. The talk covered important topics such as Hepatitis A, B, C as well as the importance of excretion as humans. The program had a participation of 27 on the first day, 32 on the second day and 25 on the last day. It was very educative.
- The Good Shepherd Congregation organized a health screening for members on the 10th of August, 2025. The screening was in regard of Hepatitis A, B, C, Malaria, Blood Pressure and Diabetes. The total number that were screened was fifty-eight.

MISSION AND EVANGELISM

a) Key Performance Indicators: M&E -01-02

Compared to 2024, the District grew by 7.17% in our total membership.

b) Strategies;

- *Evangelism Consultation*: An Evangelism Consultation and Church Growth review was held on 14th December, 2025 at Emmanuel Congregation- Fise. Fifty-two (52) members were expected to attend the program. A total number of forty-six (46) members participated. The purpose of this consultation was basically to evaluate Church growth strategies employed by the Congregations and how to develop new strategies to achieve growth.
- *Passion Week Passion for Souls Program*: **The Committee organized an Evangelism at St. Charles Preaching Pont area on 16th of March, 2024. Twenty-three members from the District participated. A total of fifty-one people were evangelized to.**
- *Prayer Bazaar*: The Fise District organized a prayer bazaar on the 22nd September, 2025 at the Emmanuel Congregation. A total of Thirty-six (36) members within the District attended. It was an impactful program.
- *Music Evangelism*: The District Mission and Evangelism Committee in collaboration with the District Singing Band and Choir organized Music Evangelism at the St. Charles School area where the young Preaching Point is located. It was a very successful program and we look forward to organizing more of such programs. The music team effectively used music to convey the message of Salvation, hope and Redemption.
- The Emmanuel Congregation in collaboration with Bethel Preaching Point children service embarked on an evangelism within the St. Charles School area on the 8th of June, 2025.

CHURCH STATISTICS

among the various age brackets reveals that the percentage of males to females widens as we move from the younger age brackets to the older age brackets. For example, while males are 47% of children under 12 years, this reduces to 34% among the children under 18 years (JY age bracket) and reduces among the youth, young adult and adults 40 years and above. They are made up of 38%, 36% and 37% respectively. This means that we have much work to do as a District to attract and retain males in our Church.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS AND EVENT

- i. The Fise District had its 2nd District Session on 18th January, 2025 and were honored to have the Clerk of Presbytery, Rev. Kennedy Kofi Asante Sarpong in attendance as well as Rev. Dr. Brandford Yeboah (RTD) and Rev. Emmanuel Osafo Boateng (RTD).
- ii. The Fise District had an induction service for our second District Minister on the 2nd of February, 2025 at the Emmanuel Congregation, the head station. Over 500 of their members attended the divine service with Rev. Enoch Adjei Pobee, the Presbytery Chairperson preaching the sermon for the day.
- iii. Also, the Emmanuel Congregation had an election on 9th of March, 2025 to elect new Presbyters. The newly elected Presbyters had an orientation on Saturday, 15th of March, 2025.
- iv. The Fise District was privileged to host the Ga West Presbytery Children's Ministry Annual Delegates Conference and thanksgiving service at the Emmanuel Congregation, the head station, on Saturday 29th and Sunday 30th March 2025.
- v. Riis Congregation had an election on the 8th of June, 2025 to elect new Presbyters. The newly elected Presbyters have officially been inducted into office.
- vi. Rev. Engr. Samuel Ampomah Sasu has been posted to Riis Congregation as the Minister in Charge while Rev. Philip Kofi Ohene has been transferred to Emmanuel Congregation, Fise as an Associate Minister.

CHALLENGES

- i. Poor Attendance of members to District Programmes

- i. Congregations should try as much as possible to submit their reports on time.
- ii. Agents should encourage their members to partake in all District Programmes and report on time.
- iii. Agents must use the Pulpit to encourage the Church members to consider the need for all members to make themselves available whenever they are called upon.
