A letters of appeal has been written to the Presbytery requesting for finance support in evangelism work within the Mission Field.

A letter has been written to Presbytery through the Mission and Evangelism Committee to support the planting of one preaching point.

(a) Objectives

- i. To strengthen the administrative department of the mission Field.
- ii. To train caretakers to become efficient and more effective

(b) Planned Activities

- i. To support caretakers to be trained as catechists or ordained ministers.

(c). Results

The caretaker for the Pompomnor Preaching Point in the person of Mr. Gabriel Darko Owusu has gone through Lay Ministerial Training at Ramseyer Training Centre, Abetifi as a Catechist awaiting Consecration by the Presbytery.

The Mission Field has plans to solicit for funds to train five caretakers this year.

North Kaneshie District YPG visited the mission Field for Evangelism

© Results;

- i. House to house Evangelism were organized in three Preaching Points; Ashamoa, Babianiha and Akuteaku respectively.
- ii. A three-day Crusade and Evangelism was organized at Fante Mayera Preaching Point during 2025 AsempaTrew was organized at Fante Mayera from 12th to 14th December 2025. 96 souls were won for Christ, 17 souls joined the Church and 2 old members rejoined the church.
- iii. Jei Krodua Preaching Point re-planted by Mission Field and Waije Gbawe District with Evangelistic activities, (Crusade, House to House, Down broadcast and football games) from 25th-28th December 2025. 120 souls won for Christ. 9 adults and 45 children joined the church.

8. CHALLENGES

- i. Due to lack of jobs in the Mission Field, members are always migrating to urban cities for job and this affects service and the growth of the church.
- ii. Members don't attend church service when there is funeral is in town. This is one of the difficulties facing the Mission Field churches.
- iii. Lack of places of worship for newly planted Preaching Points. (Kojo Ashong Preaching Point has been in existence for the past 7 years and they don't have a

permanent place of worship. They are currently worshiping on someone's land with a canopy. This stacks the growth of a church.

- iv. The Mission Field needs Evangelism equipments (Projector, Horns speakers, Microphones, Generator, Projector screen and lighting system) for outreach programs
- v. The Mission Field is financially handicap by putting up pavilions and to purchase lands for some locals.

9. RECCOMENDATIONS

We plead with the Presbytery to continuing support the Mission Filed and linkup the Preaching Points in Mission Field to other Districts to support the churches to acquire land and build pavilion for them to boost the growth of the church.

10. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Pavilion project is very helpful for the growth of the Church and a morale booster for the members of the Preaching Points who are benefitting.
