**c. Agents of the Church**

### 3.0 MEMBERSHIP DATA

The table below gives a pictorial view of the numerical strength of the District in the past year. It is evident that we could not attain the 10% growth rate as indicated in the TYRP or Strategic Plan by the Presbyterian Church of Ghana.

In as much as our target was not met, there was an increase in the total membership from 10462 in 2024 to 10948 in 2025 depicting a 4.43% rise. We shall continue to strengthen our evangelistic activities this year to be able to win more souls for the church.

### 4.0 MEETINGS/ASSEMBLY

During the year under review, a number of meetings were held and these included the 18<sup>th</sup> District Session which took place at Divine Congregation on 25<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2025.

Also, the District Session Council as required by Article 14 of the Church's Constitution met four times during the year where matters requiring attention were discussed.

## **5.0 POSTINGS/TRANSFERS**

Unlike the previous year that no Minister was transferred from the District, in the year 2025 two Ministers from the Trinity Congregation were transferred to other districts. These were Rev. Mrs Joana Akweley Koranteng, Associate Minister and Rev. Dr. Victor Zizer, a Tent Minister. Similarly, two others were also transferred from their previous stations and districts to join the Kwashieman District. Rev. Nii Armah Ayitey was posted to Peniel Congregation as the Minister in charge of the congregation. Again, Rev. Nicholas Martey came to replace Rev. Joana Koranteng as the Associate Minister at the Trinity Congregation. Both are yet to be inducted/introduced accordingly.

## **6.0 SEND-OFF/RETIREMENT**

In the year 2025, send-off services were held for the two Ministers that were transferred from our district namely; Rev Mrs Joana Koranteng and Rev. Dr. Victor Zizer on 7<sup>th</sup> September, 2025 and 30<sup>th</sup> November 2025 respectively.

Also, a valedictory and retirement service in honour of Cat. Owusu Akuamoah was held at the Prince of Peace Congregation on 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2025 after having served for 22 years in the Kwashieman District and proceeded on his compulsory retirement. All three services were spearheaded by the District Minister with assistance from the District Clerk and District

Lay Rep. It is to be noted that, these programmes were beautifully attended by members of the District Council and family members of the celebrants.

## 7.0 AKWEIMAN PROJECT

To the glory of God, the Kwashieman District started with the erection of poles for the construction of a pavilion for Akweiman Preaching Point in the Mission Field. The roofing has been done as well and it is the expectation of leadership that, the next phase being, blocks laying will be done during the first quarter of this year.

## 8.0 DEPARTMENTAL GOALS

The report on departments or committees are based on the summary of annual reports collated from the twelve congregations that were under the Kwashieman District during the year under review and are based on the PCG-Strategic Plan;

### 1) Over-arching Goals:

The District met its target under the over-arching goals as in every quarter, the congregations were able to send their reports timely to the District and from the District to Presbytery without any delays.

### 2) Mission & Evangelism:

There was an increment in the number of souls won as compared to 2024, however, we could not meet our target. I humbly call on all congregations to review the target they set for their various locals as our target of 2092 in 2025 was on the high side. Also, the other KPIs under Mission and Evangelism all saw a minimal increase although targets were not fully met.

### 3) Administration and Human Resource Management:

The AHRM committees in the various congregations did not offer trainings to the agents/ staff as expected, although a few reported on that. Based on this, the target set for the year was not attained. It is worthy of mention that the congregations were able to insure their landed properties from 12 in 2024 to 14 in 2025, unfortunately, only 5 of these properties were insured with the TIB.

### 4) Ecumenical and Social Relations:

The District did not meet its target under all the activities captured under the Ecumenical and Social Relations. This is therefore a clarion call for the District ESR Coordinator and committee members to up their game so that members from the congregations would be interested to participate in programmes for the desired results come next year.

### 5) Development & Social Services:

The promotion of healthy living, sanitation and care of the environment were encouraged throughout the locals and the groups within the church. The target for Christmas Street Party was not met as a district although the number of people fed was 1089 as against 467

in 2024. This is quite encouraging and we hope to meet the set target this year. Also, many general welfare needs of members were carried out throughout the locals during the year under review.

**6) Finance:**

All transfers to the higher courts were duly sent and in time.

**7) Church Life and Nurture:**

Targets on attendance to church and group meetings under Church Life and Nurture were not met. It is sad to say that, attendance to both church services and group meetings were not encouraging at all as this reflected on the plan collated. Despite this poor attendance, I must say that the number of persons that supported in soul winning shot from 337 in 2024 to 555 in 2025; a clear indication of exceeding our set target of 476.

## 10.0 NOTABLE EVENTS

- A covenant service was held for all Agents, all current and past Presbyters and all group leaders (both district and local groups) on 10<sup>th</sup> January, 2025 at Trinity Congregation with the sermon given by the District Minister; Rev. Kofi Manukure Akyeampong. Attendance was very encouraging.
- Cat Edward Darkwah (Divine Congregation), Cat Edward Tetteh (Hope Congregation) and Cat Justice Asiamah (Zion Congregation) were introduced in their respective congregations after having been reassigned to their current stations. The ceremony was held on 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> January 2025 and 16<sup>th</sup> February 2025 respectively for the three catechists. Council members graced all three ceremonies.
- An induction service in honor of Cat Frank Osei Mensah took place at Faith Congregation on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2025. The District Minister officiated the service with the assistance of the District Clerk.
- The District Mission and Evangelism Coordinator together with his team were at Akweiman, a Mission Field on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2025 to prepare the grounds for a massive evangelism prior to Emmaus Day Celebration at the Mission Field. The visit was fruitful.
- The Catechist in charge of Anyaa Last Stop Preaching Point was inducted into office on 30<sup>th</sup> March, 2025. The ceremony was officiated by Rev. Dr. Paapa Puplampu who deputized for the District Minister and he was assisted by both the District Session Clerk and the District Lay Rep.

- The District took its turn of the Lent Prayer meeting at Kokrobite on 8<sup>th</sup> April, 2025. Also a cross-section of members joined the Presbytery with the Holy Saturday Prayers at Kokrobite on 19<sup>th</sup> April, 2025.
- The Presbytery Chairperson, Rev. Enoch Pobee joined the Trinity Congregation on Easter Sunday to celebrate the resurrection of Christ. The Chairperson gave the sermon for the day while the liturgy was done by the District Minister, Rev. Kofi Manukure Akyeampong. Attendance was very encouraging with most members adorned in their bicentennial cloth
- The 2025 Emmaus Day celebration took place at Akweiman with the entire district converging at the place. Activities carried out included Jesus Boutique where clothing were given to the folks, there was also fun games and merry making. The District had raised funds to build a pavilion for them.
- Two seminarians in the persons of Mr. Fei Dankwah and Mr. Adjetey Annan were seen off on the 27<sup>th</sup> April 2025 after having spent a year's attachment at the Trinity Congregation. Both received packages from the local congregation (Trinity) as well as the district.
- A large number of congregants and people from Kwashieman and its environs joined the District in its Annual Prayer Convention held at Trinity on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025. The programme was successfully held.
- The department of Development and Social Services together with Sight for Africa Eye Clinic organized a free screening exercise on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025. The exercise took place at the forecourt of Trinity Congregation where a number of congregants and members of the community had their eyes screened.
- A seminar for BECE candidates was held at Trinity on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2025 with a total of eighty – two (82) of our JY members taking part and twenty-four (24) non-members also participating.
- The launch of Benk-Huggs Foundation Menstrual Hygiene Project which is aimed at increasing access to locally sourced and reusable sanitary pads was held at the Trinity Congregation on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2025. The Kwashieman District supported the project with GH10,000.00
- The department of Development and Social Services collaborated with the National Health Insurance Scheme where officers from the NHIS were at Trinity on 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2025, to register new applicants and renew expired registration of members. The exercise was very fruitful since some community members also took advantage and came to register.
- The District Minister, District Clerk, Lay Rep, DCLAN and the Mission and Evangelism Coordinator were at Akweiman, in the Mission Field on 4<sup>th</sup> July 2025 to

cut sod for the construction of a place of worship for the preaching point. In attendance too was the Ga West Mission Field Coordinator and few members of the Akweiman Preaching Point.

- The annual Housebound Service organized by Trinity Congregation for all housebound members came on the 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 with a total of forty-three members attending the service after which each housebound was given a packed of meal and an undisclosed amount of money.
- The District YPG made a donation of twenty (20) plastic chairs to the only Preaching Point in the District that is, Anyaa Last Stop Preaching Point. This presentation was done after a successful evangelism embarked by the group to help in winning souls for the local.
- A post ordination thanksgiving service for Rev Ben Darko Nyarko was held at Hope Congregation, Santa Maria on 20<sup>th</sup> July 2025. The event was witnessed by the district minister and other council. A pulpit donated by Rev Ben Darko Nyarko and family was dedicated to the glory of God by the district minister; Rev Kofi Manukure Akyeampong.
- The Officers of the Ga West Presbytery led by the Chairperson, Rev Enoch Pobee were in the district on 30<sup>th</sup> July, 2025 to inspect facilities at Zion Congregation, Awoshie and to ascertain the church's preparedness to become a district. The Officers were impressed and encouraged the local to speed up on all works being done as we await the final inspection by the Clerk of the General Assembly in due course.
- The District JY embarked on a Youth Camp at Anagkazo Bible College, Akwapim-Mampong from 21<sup>st</sup> -24<sup>th</sup> August, 2025. In all, a total of two hundred and four (204) people comprising one hundred and seventy-three (173) Junior Youth members, twenty-seven (27) leaders, two (2) nurses and two (2) caterers participated in the programme. It is to be noted that the district minister and DCLAN visited the group while they were at Akwapim- Mampong.
- A post commissioning thanksgiving service in honour of Rev Isaac Aryeh took place at the Zion Congregation, Awoshie on 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2025.
- On 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2025, the Clerk of General Assembly together with his Personal Assistant came for the final inspection of Zion Congregation in preparation for the

creation of the new Awoshie District. In attendance too were the Ga West Presbytery Officers, District Standing Committee and Implementation Committee members.

- All congregations in the district participated fully in the fundraising towards the Kutunse Project on Sunday, 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2025.

## **CONCLUSION**

I would like to reiterate that although we could not meet most our targets for the year 2025, yet we made some significant strides which cannot be overlooked. As we reflect on our areas of success, we also acknowledge our shortcomings and would work at them for the betterment of the Mighty Kwashieman District.




