1.0 INTRODUCTION

This report covers activities of the Mamprobi District for the period 1st January to 31st December, 2025. The report focuses on the Organization and Staffing, Overarching Goals, Departmental Goals, Key Performance Indicators (KPI), the extent to which they were met and strategies. It also touches on some Notable Achievements & Events and Major Challenge(s) encountered during the year under review.

2.0 ORGANIZATION AND STAFFING

3.0 OVER ACHING GOAL

3.1 Membership Statistics:

DOG – 01: On Growth of membership, the District, during the year under review increased from 4,861 to 5,143, representing a growth of (5.80%) in 2025, compared to 8.09% growth in 2024. There was therefore a numerical growth of 282. This was achieved through increased efforts in evangelism and other activities to maintain retention.

DOG – 02 - 04: The District to a large extent was able to meet almost all statutory reporting deadlines to the Presbytery. Notwithstanding the challenges associated with Congregations and Preaching Points in submitting their reports. However, the District is bent on finding innovative ways to help minimize these delays.

DOG – 05: The appraisal and performance targets were done for all Agents in the District by the District Minister.

4.0 DEPARTMENTAL GOALS

4.1 Committee on Mission and Evangelism

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DME – 01: Out of a target of 971, the District was able to win 367 Souls to the Glory of God

DME – 01B: The District improved on the number of people attending Discipleship classes organized for new converts and members. 63 newcomers and beginners attended as against 53 targeted for 2025.

DME – 02: It was targeted to undertake 19 mission activities in the Year 2025 and was able to plan and execute all Mission Activities successfully.

DME – 02B: Under this Ministry, the District targeted reaching out to 19 inmates. Ebenezer and Love Congregations were able through their visits reached out to 51 inmates. The District plans to improve upon their efforts in the ensuing years to ensure the recidivism rate is reduced.

DME – 03: No new preaching points were planted in the year 2025 but the existing ones were supported to ensure that they grew in numbers.

DME – 04: We are hope to inaugurate Congregations in the near future as we have 3 strong growing preaching points in the district.

(b) Strategies

- We are plan to refine and increased efforts towards evangelism such as house to house, Dawn broadcast, Market and school evangelism, hospital evangelism and Police cells evangelism, Open air crusades and film show evangelism by some District groups together with other mission activities of the congregations and Preaching Points within the District.

(c) Way forward

The District looks forward to continuous collaboration between District Committee on Mission and Evangelism and

other stakeholders to ensure enhanced a vigorous soul winning and retention.

4.2 ADMINISTRATION & HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DAHRM – 01: On Agents are regularly trained 4 days per person out of a target of 10 days.

DAHRM – 02: On staff of District are trained 2 days per person.

DAHRM – 03: This is not applicable.

DAHRM – 04: This is not applicable.

4.2.1 COMMITTEE ON PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT, BUILDING AND PROPERTIES

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DAHRM – 05: Most Lands belonging to the Congregation and District are duly registered. The land which was gifted to Hope Congregation by Elder Paul Yeboah a member of Christ Apostolic Church is yet to acquire a land title certificate.

DAHRM – 06: Of the year 2025, a total of 2 landed properties in the District have been insured as at the end of 2025 as against 8. This represents 25% of the total landed properties in the District. TIB is the Insurance Brokers.

DAHRM – 07: The District was unable to acquire the land for its targeted Preaching Point due to financial constraints.

DAHRM – 08: The District is looking at Securing land at a cost of GHS 1,200,000.00 for Salvation Preaching Point

DAHRM – 09: The District has successfully obtained permission from Sikkens to use a suitable space at their Agbogbloshie Branch for the Agbogbloshie Preaching Point to hold its Sunday worship services.

(b) Strategies

- The District facilitated the attendance of both the District Session Council Standing Committee and the District Session Council Meeting as scheduled.
- The implementation coordinators met with stakeholders on updates and reported effectively on the TYRP.
- The District /Congregational AHRMs conducted capacity building workshops for the staff within the District.

(c) Way Forward

The District will continue to encourage the fourth congregation to acquire land title certificate and promptly insure newly acquired landed properties

4.3 ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DESR – 01: The District could only organize 4 out of 16 activities targeted under public interest activities. These activities subsequently had 307 persons attending as against the target of 225.

DESR – 02: The District had participated in 14 local council of churches activities with 131 members attending hence exceeding the target of 5 programs with 80 expected member attendance.

DESR – 03: No interfaith activities were attended.

DESR – 04: 1 visitations to the palace was organized by one congregation within the District out of a set target of 1.

(b) Strategies

- Congregations and Preaching Points within the District took part in the celebration of Bible Week and Christian Home Week.
- The District Women’s Fellowship and the Congregational Women’s Fellowship took turns to celebrate the World Day of Prayer.

(C) Way Forward

The District in collaboration with the Congregations and Preaching Points will increase efforts to promote healthy relationships that will enhance co-existence within its environs.

4.4 DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DDSS – 01: The District could not meet its target of 21 activities with a target of 82 participants, however with the 19 that were successfully organized under the healthy living, sanitation, and care for the environment saw a member participation of 94

DDSS – 02: The District through the congregations provided livelihood development and integration of persons for 5 person who availed themselves to match up to the targeted figure of 6.

DDSS - 03: The District in has started a readers club on financial management and entrepreneurship with 14 people attending as against a set target of 11 activities and 135 participants.

DDSS – 03B: A total number of 686 persons were fed as against 440 targeted at the Christmas Street Party organized by 3 congregations and 2 preaching point.

DDSS – 04: 69 persons were supported with their welfare needs during funerals, marriages, naming ceremonies, homebound visitation among others. The set target was 613. A total of GH¢ 43,480.00 was expended as against GH¢ 15,986.00.

DDSS – 05: 11 Members were supported to the tune of GHC 4,204.00 regarding fire ravaged stores and request for financial assistance.

DDSS – 06: 19 out of the targeted 457 needy members were offered livelihood support. An amount of GH¢ 8,354.00 was expended as against the target of GH¢2,900.00.

(b) Strategies

- The month of May continued to be the month of Blood Donation, a collaboration between the District, Ebenezer Congregation, and the Ghana Blood Bank
- November is the month of Empowerment, an annual activity spearheaded by DYAF
- Sanitation Day was marked in all Congregations and Preaching Points with DDSS facilitating Health talks during the Health Week Celebration in the Congregations

(c) Way Forward

- The District will beef up support for the indigenes and the extremely distressed members
- The Congregations will be encouraged to keep adequate and accurate data on activities performed to enhance reporting.

4.5 COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

(a) Key Performance Indicators and the extent to which they were met:

DFIN – 01: The Annual Audited Account was duly submitted by the set date.

DFIN - 02: GH¢ 180,923.50 representing 8.1% of the total expenditure was spent on Mission & Evangelism, Welfare, Education, and Scholarship as against the target of GH¢ 152,166.16

DFIN – 03: The District addressed all financial obligations to the Church, like payment of Weekly Contributions, Statutory Payments, and Audit among others

DFIN – 03B: An amount of 19,886.00 was raised as funds by Congregations for the Kutunse Project

(b) Strategies

- Congregations and Preaching Points were regularly reminded of their financial obligations and the need to fulfill them promptly.
- The DCOF and the Internal Audit Team through education encouraged healthy financial practices in the Congregations and Preaching Points and even Groups.

4.6.1 EDUCATION

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DEdu – 01: The target of 7 candidates obtaining Aggregate 36 or better in the BECE in public schools that are supported by the church (congregation /Preaching Points) was not achieved.

DEdu – 02: The District held 6 School Worship out of the set target of 30.

DEdu – 03: Number of persons who participated in speaking and reading Ghanaian Languages (non-formal education) was 9 against the set target of 23.

DEdu-04: We continue to work with leadership St Mary’s school to have access to the NUPSG group.

4.6.2 SCHOLARSHIP

(a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DEdu-05: Only two visits were made to our members in SHS and tertiary institutions.

DEdu-06: 46 Young members were mentored at JY. This represents 820.0% year on year growth rate.

DEdu-07: The congregations provided scholarship support to about 4 poor and needy students representing 100.0% year on year growth.

b) Strategies

- Once again the District Committee on Education through the Congregations and Preaching Points encourage the learners of the Basic schools to be conscientious and avoid as much as possible the many detractors so they can excel holistically for the church is very much open to support them as required.
- Some congregations organized free tuition in their premises for candidates whilst preparing to write the Basic Education Certificate Examination
- Victory Congregation continued to hold School Worship service at Mt. Zion Academy Basic School

c) Way Forward

- The District hopes to continue to work on having access to St. Mary's Senior High School so to engage in the NUPSG programs.
- Again the District through the Committee on Education will support the congregation to map up a few basic schools in their environs for the purpose of actively promoting school worship.
- The District intends to visit Mamprobi Senior High School for the purpose of engaging Presbyterian students in admission though it's a day school.

4.7.1 CHURCH LIFE & NURTURE

a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DCLN – 01: An average of 1,379 attendance to church service was achieved across the children, Junior Youth and Adult members over the period. This was less than the target of 1,437 but better than the previous year's actual which showed an increase of 14.0% year on year growth.

DCLN – 02: Out of the target of 233 average attendances to Generational group meetings, 170 was not achieved with a year on year growth of -23.8%

DCLN – 03: A total of 116 members participated in varied soul winning activities as against the target of 223 resulting in a year-on-year growth of 205.3%

DCLN – 04: 7 persons. day training was achieved over the set target of 45 for Presbyters, Committee members and Group Executives being regularly trained.

b) Strategies

C) Way Forward

- The District through CLAN will come up with innovative worshipping styles that cut across all age brackets to enhance church service and group meeting attendance.
- Church leadership is to ensure effective and efficient ways of keeping data on attendance

4.7.2 COUNSELING & FAMILY LIFE

a) Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the extent to which they were met.

DCLN 05: 19 out of the target of 14 Guidance and Counseling programs of identifiable interest groups and needs were organized. 94 people participated in the various programs as against 108 people targeted.

DCLN – 06: 100 persons were counseled in the areas of their career, grief, and family life among others, though the set target was 60. This resulted in a year-on-year growth of 194.1%

b) Strategies

c) Way Forward

The District will continue to encourage Agents, Congregational Sessions and family life committees to support and engage members in their time of grief and other stressful moments.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS AND EVENTS

1. Workshop on District Financial Policy

On Tuesday, 14th January 2025, the Mamprobi District organised a workshop on the District's Financial Policy, as scheduled in the 2025 calendar for 'Trainings, Workshops, and Seminars'. The session aimed to introduce and reinforce the framework and policy guidelines governing all financial transactions within the District. All members of the District Session Council were in attendance.

2. 2024 District Session Held in January 2025

The 8th Ga West Presbytery Session (held from 13th to 17th April 2024), directed all Districts to begin piloting January District Sessions starting from 2025. The Mamprobi District held its 2024 District Session on Saturday, 18th January 2025, at Ebenezer Congregation.

1. Meeting of District Presbyters – Past and Present

On Sunday, 16th January 2025, a meeting was convened for all current and former Presbyters within the District. The main agenda was to elect new executives and reorganise the Mamprobi District Presbyters Conference. The session was facilitated by Mr. Nicolas Owusu, Vice President of the Ga West Presbytery Presbyters Conference, and was attended by 44 participants.

2. "Love Connects" – Relationship Summit

The District hosted a Relationship Summit on Saturday, 15th February 2025, under the theme "Love Connects." The program, designed for both singles and married couples in and around Mamprobi, aimed to offer Christian guidance on partner selection and strengthening marital relationships. Rev. and Mrs. Walter Kpentey, from PCG Calvary Congregation, Sakaman, facilitated the event, which recorded a participation of 143 individuals.

3. Election and Induction of 3rd District Lay Representative

During the 7th District Session on Saturday, 18th January 2025, Catechist Dr. Foster Ansong Bridjan was elected as the 3rd District Lay Representative, succeeding Mr. Joshua Addae-Boateng Esq, who had completed his five-year term. The induction service was held on Sunday, 16th February 2025, at PCG Ebenezer Congregation, Mamprobi.

4. Launch of the PCG Convention Centre (Kuntunse) Project

On Sunday, 23rd February 2025, the Ga West Presbytery launched the **PCG Convention Centre (Kuntunse) Project** at Ebenezer Congregation, Mamprobi. The initiative is part of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana's plan to construct a

modern conference centre ahead of its bicentennial anniversary. The Mamprobi District proudly hosted this significant event.

5. Induction of New Executives – Presbyters’ Conference

On Sunday, 9th March 2025, an induction service was held at Ebenezer Congregation, Mamprobi, for the newly elected executives of the Mamprobi District Presbyters Conference. The occasion also featured a citation presentation in honour of the outgoing executive members for their dedicated service.

6. Financial Training for Treasurers and Financial Secretaries

At the invitation of the District’s Committee on Finance, the Ga West Presbytery Financial Team conducted a training session on Saturday, 8th March 2025, for Treasurers and Financial Secretaries from the various Congregations, Preaching Points, and Generational Groups. The training, aimed at strengthening financial oversight in accordance with PCG policies and best practices, was facilitated by Mr. Nathaniel Adjetei Lommo (Presbytery Accountant) and Mr. Richmond Lartey (Internal Auditor). Sixteen (16) participants took part in the session.

7. First Meeting of the Newly Inducted District Presbyters Conference

Following their induction on Sunday, 9th March 2025, the Mamprobi District Presbyters Conference held its first official meeting on Saturday, 22nd March 2025, at the Ebenezer Chapel, Mamprobi. The session was graced by the presence of Rev. Cdre. Paul Adjei Djan, who served as the resource person for the meeting, providing spiritual guidance and leadership direction.

8. Visit to Akoteaku Preaching Point by District Delegation

On Sunday, 15th June 2025, a delegation from the Mamprobi District paid a visit to the Akoteaku Preaching Point as part of efforts to assess its growth and support the local congregation. The delegation included the District Minister, District Session Clerk, District Lay Representative, members of the District Mission and Evangelism Committee, and selected representatives from each generational and interest group.

The visit was aimed at strengthening fellowship, evaluating current outreach efforts, and identifying opportunities for further development of the preaching point. As part of the visit, the delegation presented a notebook for chronicling events of the preaching point. The District also donated T-shirts and assorted clothing items to members of the local congregation, further demonstrating the District’s commitment to holistic ministry and community support.

9. District Prayer Retreat

On Friday, 4th July 2025, the Mamprobi District held a District Prayer Retreat at Ebenezer Congregation. The spiritually enriching program was led by Rev. Daniel Wilson Akakpo of Kaneshie Congregation, assisted by Evangelist Emmanuel Clotey of North Kaneshie Congregation. The retreat offered an opportunity for collective prayer, spiritual renewal, and reflection, drawing members together in unity and devotion.

10. Send-Off Service for Outgoing District Lay Representative

On Sunday, 10th August 2025, the Mamprobi District held a special send-off service at Ebenezer Chapel, Mamprobi, in honour of Mr. Joshua Addae-Boateng, Esq., the outgoing District Lay Representative.

The service was organised to celebrate and express heartfelt appreciation for his outstanding leadership and unwavering dedication over the past five years of service. Mr. Addae-Boateng’s commitment, wisdom, and contributions significantly advanced the mission of the District, and the occasion served as a fitting tribute to his impactful tenure.

11. District All-Night Service

The Mamprobi District organized a District All-Night Service on Friday, 5th September 2025, at Ebenezer Congregation. The event served as a time of intense prayer, praise, and worship, bringing together congregants across the District to seek God's guidance and empowerment.

12. Meeting with all YAF members in the District

A meeting between the District Minister and all District Youth Association Fellowship (YAF) members was held on Sunday, 5th October 2025 at the Ebenezer Congregation. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the current state of the District YAF and to deliberate on practical strategies to revive and strengthen the fellowship.

13. District Evangelism Consultation

The District, in collaboration with the District Committee on Mission and Evangelism, organized an Evangelism Consultation for all Agents, Presbyters, and members of the Committee on Mission and Evangelism at both the District and Local levels. The consultation was held on Thursday, 27th November 2025, at Hope Congregation, Korle-Gonno, and was facilitated by Rev. David Sowateye Obli.

The purpose of the consultation was to deliberate on strategic approaches to evangelism within the District, strengthen collaborative efforts among Congregations and Preaching Points, and share insights on effective mission practices.

14. Training on Mushroom Farming

The District Committee on Development and Social Services, together with members of the District, paid a visit to the Agape Mushroom Farm at Teiman–Abokobi. The delegation comprised ten (10) adults and three (3) children drawn from the Love, Hope, Ebenezer, and Salvation Groups. During the visit, participants were taken through the entire mushroom production process, including substrate preparation, inoculation, and harvesting. The visit generated considerable enthusiasm among participants, with one member purchasing several grow bags to begin experimenting with mushroom cultivation at home.

15. Asempatrew

The District Session Council Standing Committee, in collaboration with the District Committee on Mission and Evangelism, organized a house-to-house evangelism exercise beginning on Friday, 12th December 2025, as part of efforts to strengthen evangelistic outreach and spread the message of salvation within the District. The outreach activities culminated in a special Asempatrew thanksgiving service held on Sunday, 14th December 2025, at the Salvation Army Park, where all Congregations and Preaching Points gathered for a united service. Overall, the activities reinforced the District's commitment to mission work, encouraged active member participation, and enhanced the Church's visibility within the community.

16. District Development Commitment and Project Options

Last year, the District purchased a motorbike for the Ga West Presbytery, an effort that was highly commended by the Presbytery. In addition, the District is expected to either procure a motorbike for the caretaker of the Akoteako Preaching Point or acquire a plot of land for the Preaching Point at a cost of GHS 30,000.00 per plot. The District is therefore required to decide which of these two projects can be undertaken within the current year.

MAJOR CHALLENGES:

The District's major challenge during the year under review continues to be members' attitude towards the businesses/activities of the District. The constant delay in submission of data and reports from Congregations, groups, and committees to the District is worrisome.

EMERGING/NEW STRATEGIC FOCUS:

Mamprobi District has already accredited itself with a 3 year Rolling Plan (TYRP) ending 2025. This document continues to

be our working document for the year ahead. May God be our helper.

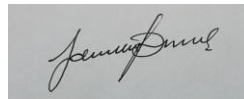

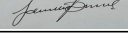
