**OBSERVATION AND SUPPORT**

It was observed by the Department that almost all our schools lack adequate resources and need the support of the Presbytery in areas of furniture, textbooks, age-appropriate reading materials, infrastructural renovation, and security issues.

A special mention was made of Weija Presby JHS, which is seriously heavily populated as a result of their academic performance and needs an additional 6-classroom unit block to ease overcrowding.

### **COMMENDATIONS**

1. The Department is commended for conducting reading assessment in all the schools.
2. The Department is commended for conducting standard BECE mock examinations for the schools.
3. The capacity development workshop organized for KG and lower Primary teachers is highly commendable.
4. The committee commends the initiative of BENK – HUGG Foundation, an NGO with Mama Kwakye as the CEO, for relentlessly supporting education.
5. The committee salutes the schools that organized a series of activities to mark Education Week 2025.
6. Emmanuel Basic and Michael Mornings JHS are commended for placing 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> positions respectively in the PEUGAR quiz contest organized by the Greater Accra Regional Education Unit
7. The Abeka District is commended for initiating the District Minister's Awards and for awarding some of their students.
8. New Life Preparatory School is highly commended on its effort to put up a new classroom block to pave way for JHS section.
9. The Kwashieman District is commended for regularly supporting and visiting NUPS-G members at the Odorgonnor SHS.
10. The Weija Presby JHS is commended for hosting Mama Kwakye, the wife of the Moderator, and her team to celebrate 2025 World Menstrual Hygiene Day.
11. The Calvary Presby Educational Complex is commended for achieving their set target of 100% BECE results.
12. Weija Presby Primary 1 is commended for participating and placing 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Seed Science International contest.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. The committee recommends that the reading assessment should be scaled up to include at least all transitional classes.
2. The committee recommends that the TVET awareness workshop organized for a few schools should be cascaded to include the rest of our schools to arouse Learners' interest in Technical and Vocational Education.
3. The committee recommends that the celebration of Education week should be observed by all our schools emphasizing on the celebration of our heritage as well as our achievements.

4. It is recommended that be schools should be encouraged to observe the Nine Lessons and Carol festival at their local levels in addition to the Zonal ones.

## **NEW ACHIMOTA**

### **OBSERVATION:**

Their report is very detailed and follows the new reporting format.

It was also observed that 25% of the adult population are non-communicants which the District has to address

### **COMMENDATION:**

1. We commend them for training two Catechists.
2. We commend the district for winning 740 Souls representing 11.2% as against 416 (6.6%) in 2024
3. We commend the district for achieving the KPI's under Education and Mission and Evangelism.
4. We commend them for purchasing land for Kofi Donkor Preaching Point which was allocated to them by the Presbytery.
5. We commend the district for their full participation in Local Council of Churches programmes.
6. We commend both the district and the locals for the ministry to the palace programmes.
7. We commend both the district and locals for their support to the Kutunse Project with Gh¢ 101,745.20 as against GH¢ 100,000.00.
8. We commend them for all the programmes they organized with NUPS-G of SHS nearby.
9. We commend Salvation Congregation for starting a music school.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

1. All Private and Public Presbyterian schools should introduce a music school in other to train our children for the church.
2. 25.79% of the adult population are non-communicants. The district should encourage such members to become communicants

## **NEW WEIJA DISTRICT**

### **OBSERVATION**

The committee observed that a significant number of 21.36% adult population is non-communicant, a figure we see it as high and needs to be addressed

## **COMMENDATIONS**

1. These Congregations / Preaching Points are commended for achieving beyond the specified ten per cent annual growth rate: New Jerusalem (10.3), Peace (10.55) and Bethel (24.16).
2. We commend the district for collating the history of all stations to update records at the district office. Others are encouraged to do likewise.
3. We commend the district for opening a church at Sunny Coast and planting the Tomefa Christ Preaching Point.
4. We commend them for the inauguration of the Peace Preaching Point to a Congregational status.
5. We commend them for instituting a task force that ensures faithful compliance to the remittance of 52/48 and all statutory payments to the respective courts.

## **SUGGESTION**

1. They seem to have ideas to address all the challenges they raised, so the committee encourages them to take proactive measures to ensure that these stated challenges do not persist by the next Presbytery Session.

## **ASHALAJA SUB-DISTRICT**

### **OBSERVATION**

It was observed that the Sub-District has a very high percentage of adults 30.95 being non-communicants which the Sub-District should develop strategies to mitigate it.

### **COMMENDATION**

- The Sub-District is commended for holding a 3-day Revival programme for its members
- The Presbytery is commended for its tenacious support to the Sub-District. The Presbytery supplied the Favour congregation manse with a double size bed, a set of sofa, a refrigerator, a 43 LED smart TV set and a gas cooker with oven among others.
- The Presbytery is again commended for cutting sod to commence the building of a manse for the Sub-District.
- The Sub-District is commended for the construction of a borehole at Ashalaja
- Presbytery Women's Fellowship, YAF, as well as the Executive Women's wing of YAF are commended for their unwavering support and visits to the Sub-District.
- The Sakaman District is commended for supporting the Sub-District with 100 bags of cement and for supporting the Krokohwe Preaching Point.

- The committee commends the Sub-District for their collaborative spirit and edge them to leverage on that to grow the Sub-District.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

The committee recommend that the Presbytery, Districts, Congregations, the Generational and Non-Generational Groups as well as well-wishers should come to “Macedonia” and support the Sub-District.

### **MANHEAN SUB-DISTRICT**

#### **OBSERVATION**

It was equally observed that a high percentage of adults are non-communicants. A whooping number of 28.9% and this needs to be addressed.

#### **COMMENDATION**

- The Sub-District is commended for planting 2 new churches at Peace Village and Afuaman New Site with the support of the NUPS-G (Legon branch) and the P-YICE respectively

- **RECOMMENDATION**

The committee recommends that the Sub-District continue with their teachings on “Stewardship and Giving” to grow the church

### **GENERAL SUGGESTION**

The committee is humbly appealing to Presbytery to encourage the Districts and Congregations that have the capability to establish Senior High Schools within the Presbytery to start one, since there is none within our Presbytery.
