INTRODUCTION

This report touches on the life of Weija Gbawe District and covers the reporting period January to December 2025.

ORGANIZATION AND STAFFING

The District is under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Samuel Nortey Adjei assisted by eight (8) Ordained Reverend Ministers, five (5) Consecrated Catechists, District Standing Committee Members and office staff who see to the day to day activities of the District as shown in the table below.

During the year under review new ministers were transferred to the district as replacements for those were transferred out of the district. They were as follows:

1. Rev. Ernest Manoah Bremang was received into the District on September 1st as Minister-In Charge of Riis Congregation, Gbawe to replace Rev. Mrs. Veronica Nkrumah Mensah who as transferred to New Jerusalem Congregation in the New Weija District.
2. Rev. Emmanuel Wiafe was also received into the District on September 1st as Minister-In-Charge of Ga West Model Church, Tetegu to replace Rev. Benajmin Asare who took a leave of absence to work abroad for a year.

3. Rev. Mrs. Juliana Aboagyewaa Afrifa was received into the District on September 1st as Minister-In-Charge of Unity Congregation, Top Base to replace Rev. Semaha Kodjo who was transferred to Tema North.
4. Rev. Dr. Joseph Zizer was received into the District on September 1st as 2nd Associate Minister of Calvary Congregation, McCarthy Hill.

Agents of the Church:

The district has 5 consecrated Catechists comprising 4 males and 1 female. It has 8 ordained Ministers with five being full-time and 3 tent. Out of the 8 ministers, 7 are males and 1 female. The district also have 1 retired minister and 1 retired catechist under its pastoral care.

OVERARCHING GOALS

a) Membership statistics:

OG-01: It will be observed that in comparison to the previous year, the district saw a 5.5% growth in membership.

b) Meeting Reporting Deadlines:

OG-02 - OG-04: The district submitted 4 quarterly reports in addition to the 2026 Strategic Plan. The district was about 85% compliant with the target dates for submission of reports.

OG-05: Unfortunately, we were not able to undertake the Appraisal and Performance Target setting for Agents, Committee Chairpersons and Staff during the year under review. Efforts will be made in the coming year to enforce the signing of performance targets.

DEPARTMENTAL GOALS

MISSION & EVANGELISM

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- ME-01: Out of a target of 589, the district won 252 souls.
- ME-02: The district planned to undertake a combined 29 mission activities in the course of the year. It however managed to do five (5) activities.

b) Strategies:

- The strategies that had the most impact on the KPIs was the re-planting of a preaching point at Jei Krodua as part of agenda to plant 1,000 churches. The Ebenezer Missions Team collaborated with the District Mission and Evangelism Team to undertake three (3) days of community reach-out. Dawn Broadcasts, House-to-House evangelism, 2 days of film show, sports evangelism and musical floats characterized the mission. The first church service on 28th December 2025 saw 122 new members participating.
- Alkokoto Al-night entered its 2nd year running during the Homowo Festivities in the district. We pray that it only gets better with each passing year.

c) Way Forward:

- It is the district's expectation that a place of worship is concluded for Jei Krodua to help the church to be firmly rooted to flourish.
- To revive the district and congregational BSPGs to improve on follow-ups.
- To continue with mission activities in the district to grow the membership
- To commence the organisation of Ministry to Police Cells and Prisons in the district.

ADMINISTRATION & HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT CHURCH LIFE AND NURTURE

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- AHRM-01: the agents in the district were equipped with training and both district and congregational levels. They also attended the health screening organised at the presbytery level.
- AHRM-02: training of staff at both district and local levels is on the lower side and needs to improve.
- AHRM-03 & 04: the re-introduction of the ERP would go a long way to help the with the registration of church membership
- AHRM-0:

b) Strategies:

- The report writing seminar organised on 5th December 2025 helped to gain an insight into the new format for reporting in the church.

c) Way Forward:

- There is the need for more training workshops at both district and congregational levels.

PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT, BUILDING AND PROPERTIES

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- AHRM-05: the district has not been able to complete any land registration process as they need to meet certain conditions.
- AHRM-06: only three (3) properties in the district have been insured which is not the best.

b) Strategies:

- The strategy to form the District Properties Committee was not successful in the period under review. The sole champion on registering properties has also bowed out leaving a gap.

c) Way Forward:

- To form the District Properties Committee to oversee the registration and insurance processed in the district.

ECUMENICAL AND SOCIAL RELATIONS

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- DESR-01: the district undertook four (4) public interest activities with a total attendance of 410 participants.
- DESR-02: only one (1) local council of churches activity was organised in the district with 60 participants.
- DESR-03: no activity was organised with the people of other faith in the district.
- DESR-04: four (4) visits were made to the palaces in the district where presentations were made for the celebration of Homowo. The district visited the Weija and Gbawe palaces with other congregations visiting the Oblogo and Tetegu palaces.

b) Strategies:

- The district's visit to the palaces saw an improvement in the relationship as plans are advanced to share the word of God at the palaces on a quarterly basis.

c) Way Forward:

- In the coming year, we would improve on ministry to people of other faith and participation in the local council of churches activities.

DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL SERVICES

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- DDSS-01: seven (7) activities were organised in the district to promote healthy living and environment awareness in the district. 591 members participated which is about 140% above the project figure of 425 people.
- DDSS-02: 38 persons with disability were supported in the district which is 422% above target.
- DDSS-03: 858 people participated in 7 entrepreneurial development activities within the district which is very encouraging. 330 children were fed in the district at the Christmas Street Party was organised in the district during the year under review.

b) Strategies:

- Organising health, healthy living and cleaning the environment has caught on in the district with most congregations having health committees.

c) Way Forward:

- Organise health walks, health talks and blood donation exercises in the district.

WELFARE

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- DSS-04: the district supported about 93 members on their needs spending GH¢102,000.00. The amount was higher than the targeted GH¢94,500.00.
- DSS-05: the district supported 40 members in distress spending about GH¢21,000.00.
- DSS-06: nineteen members were supported to improve upon their lives in the

district.

b) Strategies:

- The strategy adopted by the congregations to take good care of its members is bringing awareness to the next level.

c) Way Forward:

- Record welfare benefits from congregational and district groups to appreciate the quality of the welfare system.
- Encourage the use of insurance packages for the welfare system

FINANCE

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- DFIN-01: the district audited the 2024 financial statement and presented to the presbytery.
- DFIN-02: the district spent 12.5% of its total expenditure to cater for the needs of its members. Although the percentage was lower than the target percentage of 24.8% actual monies spent over targeted was 2% above targeted figure of GH¢109,222.00.
- DFIN-03: all payments to Presbytery and General Assembly Council were duly remitted and on time.
- DFIN-04: the district targeted to support the Kuntunse project with GH¢12,000.00. A total amount of GH¢17,130.50.

b) Strategies:

- The exchange of pulpit programme continues to help the district raise the needed money to fund some projects especially the Oblogo Chapel.
- The open door policy to tell the financial position at all council and standing committee meetings has helped tremendously.

c) Way Forward

- Strengthen the Exchange of Pulpit
- Enforce the 5% development levy on harvest proceeds
- Continue to engage congregations to finance the purchase of the chapel for Jei Krodua.

EDUCATION

a) Key Performance Indicators:

- DEdu-01: the district got 24 BECE candidates obtaining better grades at the 2025 BECE Examinations.
- DEdu-02: To the glory of God, school worship re-commenced in the Presby Public and Private Schools in the district. The worship was extended to Gonse Public School. A total of seven (7) worship services were held.
- DEdu-03: apart from JY members writing Twi and Ga proficiency exams, the district did not promote non-formal education activities in the district.
- DEdu-04: no NUPSG activity was supported in the district probably due to lack of SHS Schools in the district.
- DEdu-05: a total of 16 students were visited by congregations in the district.

- b) Strategies:
 - The district organised BECE briefing for over 200 students in the year under review to prep them up for the exams.
 - The Education Committee liaised with the Mission and Evangelism Committee to get preachers for school worship. This collaboration is working well.
 - More visitations to the SHS and tertiary schools will be encouraged.
- c) Way Forward:
 - Liaise with the assembly to organise non-formal education classes in the district.
 - Organise Twi and Ga proficiency exams for the children to keep the mother tongues alive.

SCHOLARSHIP

- a) Key Performance Indicators:
 - 126 members were given various degrees of scholarship support in the period under review.
- b) Strategies:
 - The need to support our students have been of critical importance.
- c) Way Forward
 - Increase the number of support for students in the district.

CHURCH LIFE & NURTURE

- a) Key Performance Indicators:
 - DCLN-01: during the period under review 1,845 members attended church service every Sunday an increase of over the targeted number 1,279 members.
 - DCLN-02: the district recorded an average attendance of 261members attending generational group meetings. It however fell short of the expected 355 members
 - DCLN-03: discipleship classes have not started in the district. Bible clubs in the district recorded an average attendance of 15 children per each meeting.
 - DCLN-04: a total number of 25person/day training was organised within the district.
- b) Strategies:
 - Constant engagement of the CLAN Groups helped improve attendance to meetings and church service.
- c) Way Forward:
 - Increase the number of bible clubs formed in the district.

COUNSELLING & FAMILY LIFE

- a) Key Performance Indicators:
 - DCLN-05: 12 activities were organised in the district which saw 276 participants in the year under review.
 - DCLN-06: 160 persons with counseling needs were attended to during the year under review.

- b) Strategies:
- There was no particular strategy but the increased sexuality and marital issues may have caused the rise in counselling and programmes to address them.
- c) Way Forward:
- Organise counselling seminars at the district level to aid bring them together.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT & EVENTS

1. The district re-planted the church at Jei Krodua on 28th December 2025.
2. Inauguration of Church Choir and Women's Fellowship at Ga West Model Church, Tetegu
3. Inauguration of Church Choir at Emmanuel, Congregation, Djanman.
4. Ms. Abigail Annoh received the best health journalist award in the year under review.
5. Mr. Jonas Nartey became the presbytery president of the Young Adults' Fellowship

1. Dissemination of information to congregants by congregational clerks.
